

Summary of Recommendations - WAC 2000 Chief Judge's Report

**Note:**

**The following proposals and recommendations were contained in the Chief Judge's Report from WAC 2000. Because they could not be submitted in time for normal consideration by Sub-Committees in May 2000, they were placed in the package of proposals to be considered in 2001. Rationale for the proposals can be found in the original report which can be obtained by contacting John Gaillard or me. Proposals 6 and 8 from the original report were already acted upon, deleted from the list below, and remaining proposals re-numbered.**

1. That Aero Clubs submit the names of Judges & approved assistants as per the regulations, to the contest organisers at least one month prior to the commencement of a contest, this list to be approved by the Bureau of CIVA, having first checked the currency, experience & eligibility of those persons proposed. Only Judges & assistants on this approved list to be allowed to participate in the contest.

2. That regulation 1.4.1.6 of the FAI Sporting Code, Section 6, be modified to read as follows:

The International Jury may temporarily vary the regulations during a contest under the following circumstances:

(a) There is 100% agreement within the International Jury with no abstentions when conducting a vote to introduce a temporary variation to the regulations.

&

(b) There is 100% agreement amongst the participating team's Chief Delegates with no abstentions when conducting a vote to introduce a temporary variation to the regulations.

3. That contest organisers, the International Jury & Chief Judge rigidly apply the regulation requiring each Aero Club to provide a suitably qualified assistant for their nominated judge, failing which the judge will not be included in the panel of judges for the contest.

4. That regulation 1.2.3.1. first sentence be reworded as follows, "The Free Programme may be composed of a maximum of 10 and a minimum of 6 figures or combination of figures.

That regulation 1.2.3.12. be replaced by the following:

Bonus points %	3	6	9	12

5. That protests made on the basis on incorrect scores as viewed on the instant scoring monitor, should not be accepted by the International Jury, until after the official scores have been posted by the Contest Director and then accepted during the official two hour protest time.

6. That should time for flying this programme become critical, the organisers should then calculate the time required to complete the programme, allowing sufficient time for computing & posting scores as well as the two-hour protest period. If necessary a reduction in the field should take place to a minimum of 10 pilots.

7. That a representative from the International Jury hold a briefing session with the organisers of contests with regards to the content & issue of paperwork, offering advice and direction as to what is contained in the regulations.
