<b>General Reports</b>
------------------------

- 2022 FAI General Conference and CASI Meetings** Report by CIAM President, Antonis Papadopoulos.  
The meeting was held via zoom and in 2023 will be held in October in USA.  
Mr David Monk has been re-elected as FAI President.  
The main discussion was about the new Sporting Code and the volume introduced by CASI.  
The CIAM President thanked Mr Delor who made most of the job for creating the new Disciplinary Code with a separated Code of Ethics. The FAI statutes refers to the Code of Ethics which is outdated and after the comments provided by the NACs, it is clear that a new version is necessary.  
The financial situation is now better and the commission accounts don't exist anymore. Also CIAM financial matters are now managed directly by FAI. The CIAM Treasurer clarified that the CIAM

Bank account is now closed and it will be substituted by a “Special Reserve” account which is not a bank account but a virtual one.

The new Disciplinary Code which was approved requires that the existing Disciplinary chapter from the General Section to be removed and to be included in a dedicated separate volume which includes the new procedure for protests and appeals.

Mr Stefan Malbos (CIVL President) did a lot of contribution for the revision of the General Section and worked together with Bruno Delor who was the coordinator for the new Disciplinary Code. Both volumes will be effective from the 1<sup>st</sup> of January 2023. There is no impact for the 2023 Championship Bulletins.

## **World Games 2022 Birmingham Alabama USA**

### **6. The World Games – TWG 2022 – Birmingham, USA**

Mr Delor informed the Bureau members for this topic. For the Drone Racing, there were 32 competitors with 20 men and 10 women (instead of 12 originally planned). The selection criteria were based on the World Cup ranking and the rest from the last World Championship. Also a wild card was offered to USA so to be able to include a woman in the event as the host country. AMA supported the event and they recommended to cooperate with David Roberts and his team. Mr. Delor mentioned that the event was very successful and perfectly organized after a lot of meetings. He mentioned that David Roberts took the leadership to negotiate with the organizers to host the event in the main stadium which was in the city center and not on the motorway. For this reason, a lot of spectators were present.

There was a very good media coverage and Mr Lazarkov, who was the chief judge, confirmed the very well organized event, much better than the World Championship in China. There was some rain and at the end, the best pilot won. The event was very useful for promoting aeromodelling.

The CIAM President informed that financially both CIAM and ISC were offered 8000 CHF, which was the double amount for what it was originally budgeted. The CIAM President is in contact with the FAI office so to evaluate this event and also to plan the next one. The next TWG will be in China.

Mr Bartovsky informed about the difficulties to manage the WCup coordinators. Mr Lazarkov had a 20% less participation. For Mr Delor, the events and the participation decreased; 8 events, 1/3 of 2019 and 170 competitors when in 2019 there were 517.

The impacts are due to the Covid, to the increase of costs and the war in Ukraine. The same is for Mr Uhlig. In the Free Flight category only a small reduction of competitors due to the missing Russian and Ukrainian competitors.

## Drones Matters

### 20. 2022 Drones World Championship in Korea

After the last Drone World Championship in China in 2019, in October 2023 the Drones World Championship will be held in South Korea. The relevant documents will be approved at the end of 2022. It will include many subevents.

There is also a request from Turkey to the FAI President for organising an event different from the past one. CIAM is now responsible for all the championship organisation, not only technical aspects.

### 21. Consideration to include a section about UAV rules in Bulletins

A zoom meeting about the UAV regulations has been held with various authorities including EASA. About 100 persons attended that meeting.

The CIAM President asked the Bureau if a section of what is required in each country for the UAV rules need to be included in the Championship bulletins.

It was agreed to include this section and the Bureau will prepare a draft for this.

## Issues

### 23. Judges education and qualification – Possible use of a tool

Two sessions of F3A judge training have been held via zoom with a lot of attendees. The CIAM President asked to take advantage of Zoom tool provided by FAI and of Basecamp tool.

The F3A Subcommittee Chairman will organise a new judge training at the end of 2023.

### 24. Championships cycle

This matter has been discussed using Basecamp tool. Each year there are from 10 to 15 CAT1 championships and for some championships the competitor participation was low. Therefore, the Bureau has to decide if the frequency of the CAT1 events has to be changed. Each subcommittee chairman expressed his opinion. At the end of the discussion there was not a common position. The majority position is to keep the existing Championships cycle.

In conclusion, it was decided to leave to each category subcommittee chairman the decision if it is necessary to change that category CAT1 championship cycle. Each subcommittee chairman can discuss this with the subcommittee members.

### 25. Length of the event

This matter has been discussed using Basecamp tool. The CAT1 events usually last one week. The Bureau has to decide if this duration can or has to be reduced for reducing the relevant costs. Each subcommittee chairman exposed his position. The common position was that a duration reduction will not help. Most of the costs are relevant to the travelling and or accommodation cost for the officials. A cost reduction would be possible if the number of judges can be reduced.

## **26. Members per team**

For each CAT1 championships, three team members per nation, plus a junior and a female, are presently allowed by the rules. The Bureau discussed if more members per team can be accepted. The CIAM President is in favour in particular when there is no world cup competition assuring the good quality of the additional selected competitors. Mr Delor pointed out that without World Cup is not possible to select good quality additional competitors. This matter will be further discussed.

The 3<sup>rd</sup> of December meeting ended after the item 26 at 12.30 and the 4<sup>th</sup> of December meeting started with item 27 at 9.30 with the same attendees.

## **27. Sanction Fees**

The CIAM President informed that in other air sports the sanction fees are a percentage of the entry fees. For ballooning there is a standard fee and a performance bond.

It is also important to combine any change in this aspect with a reduction to the sanction fees paid by the organizers. A fee that can be applied to each participant may also be better for classes with less participants and for classes with big attendance this can be a benefit for CIAM. For example 10€ per competitor could be a good compromise without a big impact.

The Bureau positions provided were various and a proposal will be provided to the next Plenary for consideration.

## **28. Jury composition**

Various Bureau members opinions were provided; use jury members remotely connected with the championships, reduce the number of jury members, the jury members are important because they check, live with directly presence, the progress of the competitions.

The CIAM President arrived to the conclusion that the number of Jury members can be linked with the number of competitors. If the event is not big and the numbers of the competitors is less than 50, an agreement with the subcommittee chairman can be achieved about the number of Jury members.

## **29. Combined Championships**

The F3 Helicopter Subcommittee Chairman explained that the F3C category has always enough entries while for F3N has low entries. The F3C and F3N classes are considered as combined WCh because the costs for F3N alone cannot be covered. The CIAM President pointed out that the Plenary approved to award the championship status to F3N only if it will be combined with F3C. The option not to organize one class like the F3N should be described in the relevant bulletin.

For F3N the same judges as of F3C were used in some occasion but some complaints have been received.

This discussion will continue.

## **30. Medals engraving**

The CIAM President will ask FAI office about the status of the engraved medals.

## **31. Female / Juniors medals**

Various Bureau members opinions were expressed. Mr Delor pointed out that the situation was the same for the Junior 20 years ago and asked to continue in this way. A proposal was to give only diplomas when no sufficient number of Females are competing.

The CIAM President proposed to continue this discussion using Basecamp tool and to consider the performance and not only the participation.

## **32. Earlier PEF**

The earlier publication of PEF was considered by the Bureau members and found not so useful because the NACs may decide to change their intention to participate after sending the PEF and the PEF cannot be sent too much in advance because the NACs have not yet selected the team to send.

### **33. Minimum number of participants in Wcup events**

Various Bureau members proposals were provided; at least 4 competitors, or bonus points based on the number of competitors, based on the decision of relevant Subcommittee Chairman. The CIAM President informed that there is a proposal from Slovakia to be discussed at the next Plenary meeting.

### **34. CIAM forms update**

The existing forms need to be updated because some of them are outdated and not contain the appropriate information. Also during the years there are some rules changes which should be reflected on the forms.

The CIAM President will work with the Technical Secretary for updating them.

### **35. Status of official classes with championships with no events**

The CIAM President asked if there is anything to be reported by the S/C chairmen. No need to discuss further this matter for this year.

### **36. Education S/C - Rookie Project**

The good ideas from Mr Findahl have good results since the Rookie project proved to be quite successful this year. A lot of Rookie kits were delivered all over the world. About 6000 rookies were involved most of them in Denmark. 400 in Poland, 500 in UK and a lot in Germany.

The relevant webpage is working but it should be more dynamic reporting new information in a shorter time.

Diploma and certificate should be distributed for promoting the project.

A live meeting could be held at the Plenary meeting in April with a brochure as a support.

The CIAM President informed that we have been approached by the full size World Championship organizer so to find a way to host a rookie project seminar during the next World Championship. This is work in progress.

Mr Findahl informed that for the Scholarships selection four names have been proposed from France, Ukraine, Slovenia and USA.

### **37. IT Projects**

The FAI IT manager is facing some problems for the AMS system since the developers are in Ukraine and the communication is not so easy due to the current nasty situation.

The CIAM events history is a project in progress. The relevant specifications have been provided by the subcommittee chairmen.

Very few countries didn't provide the judge nominations using the tool. For this matter Mr Eissing will chase India since the F7 S/C is only populated from Germany and India.

Mr Delor asked news about Noosphere tool which is used for the management of the Drone Racing event. He asked if the tool can be used at least for the registration. For the scoring, Korea has its own system. The same problem is for the Space Models Championships.

### **38. CIAM Legends medal**

Three designs were presented and the majority of the Bureau members selected option 1. A different color could be required and the CIAM President will check about the relevant cost. The first batch of CIAM Legends medal will be awarded at the 2023 General Conference.

A Greek company is able to produce medals at the cost of about 10 euros. They already produce the medals for the Olympic Games. In Switzerland are more expensive and the mould will cost about 400 euros and will be then property of CIAM.

The artist of the proposed medal is an FAI Paraglider and he refused any compensation. The Bureau agreed to make anyway an offer to him.

It was discussed about the CONTEST-Eurotour organisation which organises European events every year in a similar way as of the World Cup.

The agreement with that organisation was initiated many years ago by Sandy Pimenoff. CIAM supported the Eurotour organisation and recently it was decided that the CONTEST-EUROTOUR will support CIAM with 2000 euros every year. Now this agreement is not any longer valid since CONTEST-Eurotour is now handled by a different organization which is MFSD, a company under the authority of the DAeC (German NAC).

Some of the Bureau members are in favour to continue the cooperation with this organisation because it was able to promote the aeromodelling sport in Europe by providing offers to competitors.

Anyway, at the end it was decided to authorize CIAM President and Peter Uhlig to negotiate the new agreement and inform the members accordingly.
