#### Meetings Procedurals

## 1. <u>Review of the 2019 December Bureau Meeting Agenda</u>

Messieurs Bruno Delor and Peter Uhlig will not attend the meeting for different reasons.

#### 2. Approval of the Minutes of the Bureau and Plenary Meetings of April 2019

The minutes were unanimously approved.

Two mistakes were noted in the Minutes of the Bureau Meeting:

- On page 6 of the un-numbered minutes, item 6.1 Show Chuck Etherington (declined) under F3 RC Aerobatics. He was actually proposed for the F1 subcommittee (so his name should be moved up one line)
- Page 17 C.11.1.a and C.11.2.a Identification marks. The text correctly notes the date for the change as amended from 2012 to 2022. However, the comment under the item states effective 01/01/20 – It is assumed that while correctly maintaining the 2022 date for the change, the new item will appear in the 2020 CGR Sporting Code in the annex for future changes.

## 3. Matters Arising

CIAM President mentioned that during the CIAM Plenary meeting several proposals were approved, which for the time being are not possible to be implemented. He noted that for the F5J class, a proposal was adopted which contained a modification to the published EDIC volume specifications of the AMRT device. In addition, the same rule contains also the specifications that are not appropriate because if a technical specification is included on the rule itself then any change has to follow the rule-freeze period. He mentioned that he will be in contact with the EDIC Chairman to take care of the new rule and the Bureau will bring a proposal to the next Plenary to clarify this matter.

## **General Reports**

## 4. <u>2019 FAI General Conference and CASI Meetings</u> Report by CIAM President, Antonis Papadopoulos.

The 113th FAI General Conference held at the Olympic Museum Lausanne ended on the 6<sup>th</sup> of December. The General Conference was moved from Morocco, where it had been planned to be held in October 2019. This was due to the NAC of Morocco failure to program and organise the FAI General Conference as expected.

Several meetings, formal and informal were held during the period of the GC.

The discussion of the serious and critical FAI financial situation took half a day to satisfactorily resolve. The original FAI budget as proposed by the FAI EB was rejected and replaced by the budget proposed by UK. It is considered that 2020 will be a difficult year with impact on some CIAM activities and expenses. Since the FAI GC ended the day before the CIAM Bureau Meeting, we expect to have additional information available from the FAI EB probably in January.

The CIAM President discussed the option available to host the Plenary Meetings in different location other than Lausanne but for this, the Plenary has to follow a different procedure described on the FAI rules. He proposed to discuss this topic during the 2020 Plenary Meeting and inform the delegates accordingly before the meeting.

## ACTION: CIAM President 2020 Plenary Meeting

Mr Markus Haggeney reported about the approved budget. The next year FAI expenses will be reduced about CHF300,000. Huge investments had been made over the last few years for media and consultancies to the amount of approximately CHF930,000. There is no common agreement if the outcomes of those investments were positive or not. The FAI GC discussions were very emotional and the FAI President worked very hard facilitating the difficult communications and relationships with the various commissions. The next FAI EB meeting will be held at the end of January or February 2020.

The CIAM President reported that the CASI activity was mainly for improving documents like the FAI Sporting Code General Section and the Code of Ethics, which is not aligned with the IOC Code. It was identified that the penalties section of the various FAI documents is not aligned and a new WG was established to take care of this issue. The CIAM President was elected again as CASI President for one more year. CIAM Bureau members Messieurs Anthonisen, Dodd and Jensen attended sessions of the FAI GC.

## 5. WAG 2022 in Turkey – CIAM Plans

Mr Markus Haggeney thanked all the CIAM Bureau Members for their good cooperation. Many Airsports Commissions are struggling to follow the FAI EB decision to organize World Championships during the WAG. CIAM Bureau's decision was and still is to organize special format events, as per the WAG concept.

During the General Conference it was announced by the FAI President that the Turkish NAC, THK, has many internal problems and because of that the government appointed a commissioner to run the business. This action is definitely affecting the schedule for the WAG

and because THK is not able to fulfil its financial obligations to FAI and it has asked to move the event to 2025. FAI EB and the Commissions Presidents Group are unanimously not in favor of this development. The GC decided to authorize FAI President to communicate with THK and announce to them this decision and find a way to terminate the project. Following this the FAI EB will open a new bid period to find a potential organizer for the next WAG edition. THK of course can participate in this bidding process.

The CIAM 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President reported on his visit to Ankara. CIAM President and the Bureau members thanked Mr. Narve Jensen for his splendid work.

**Post Meeting Note:** FAI EB decided to review the WAG concept from the beginning.

## 6. Air Games Series – TWG 2021 – Birmingham, USA

Mr Markus Haggeney showed a presentation about the WGS which was prepared by the former FAI Secretary General Mr. Max Bishop, and currently acting as Vice-President of the International World Games Association (IWGA).

The budget is about €18 m, and the games are to be held in the Campus of the University in Birmingham, Alabama, USA. They will last 11 days, involving approximately 3000 persons from 30 different sports. The airsports involved will be Canopy Piloting (Parachuting) and Drone FPV Racing. For the drone event, 32 competitors and 14 officials will be required. Dates are 15 to 25 July 2021.

The next WGS will be organized in 2025, in Chengdu, China. The FAI General Conference confirmed that FAI is interested in participating.

It is requested to have 50% female competitors and an effort is required to make Canopy Piloting and Drone races more attractive for women.

The CIAM President reminded that the International World Games Association is an organization recognized by the International Olympic Committee (IOC). At the last FAI GC, two members of IOC made a presentation about IOC criteria for selecting sports, highlighting that many requirements have to be fulfilled.

The Chinese Taipei delegate, Mrs Elsa Mai, informed delegates at the FAI GC how the World Games are important for the Chinese Taipei Aeronautical Federation. There are government funds available for the sports which participate at the World Games where multi-sports events are held. Chinese Taipei NAC will try to have a competitor to participate at the World Games in order to benefit from this. In Asian countries, most of the governments are favoring events, which are organized together with IOC.

Mr Markus Haggeney confirmed that FAI is member of the IWGA and it is firmly committed to participate to the WG. No vote is required for approving the FAI participation.

## 11. Judges' performance at FAI World and Continental Championships

## 11.1. Judges' analysis: F2B, F3A, F3C, F3N, F3P, F4, S

The involved subcommittee chairmen reported no issues about the judges performances during the various Championships.

The CIAM President informed that the FAI GC asked for information about the quality of the judges. It was indicated, from the non-European delegates, that not many FAI competitions are organized outside Europe due to the quality of the judges. In fact, FAI is considered to be too Euro-centric, which is not the case.

The Helicopter and Space subcommittee chairmen proposed to prepare training aids for improving the judges' quality.

It is required that the involved chairmen make some proposals for improving judges' performances.

### 12. Casualties during CIAM events. Actions

The Chinese Taipei NAC President, Mrs Elsa Mai, reported about the fatal accident that occurred there, last November during an F3F World Cup event.

A woman bystander, well away from the defined flying field, was hit by a plane, which was flown by a participant in this competition. As a result of the impact the woman lost her life and her son, who was with her, suffered minor injuries.

Mr Andreas Fricke was Jury president and provided a lot of support to the organizer and a lot of information to FAI.

The public investigation is still on going in Chinese Taipei and the local Civil Aviation Authority is not going to consider this incident as an aviation accident so no report will be provided from this source. Therefore, Mrs Mai asked for CIAM's support, because this fatality is going to affect the entire aeromodelling activity in her country, and not just the specific F3F class. In Chinese Taipei there are competitions in helicopters and drones and there is a will to bid for an FAI CAT1 event soon.

The CIAM President is considering what kind of support can be provided by CIAM as a sport organization. The pressure of the international media is still ongoing.

Mr. Dodd informed about his experience as F3D-F5D World Championships organizer in Australia. A risk assessment, for identifying the potential hazards, was conducted by the organizer to be approved by the Australian NAC when the risks are mitigated. He considers it vital when the public is involved.

Therefore, it is useful to prepare a document that will be suitable for all CIAM events. The risk assessment prepared by MAAA will serve as guideline. Mr Eissing informed that some safety documentation is available from UAVs ruling authorities.

Mr Markus Haggeney informed that FAI is looking to update the existing "Casualties Guidelines". It is due for next year.

## **ACTION: CIAM President**

The CIAM President wants to find a way for supporting Chinese Taipei NAC and he will be in touch with her.

A document related to safety can be included in the Jury Pack. Mr Dodd can provide a risk assessment document for instructing the organisers.

At the WAG in Dubai, The Pylon Racing Subcommittee Chairman, Mr Metkemejier, had to fill in a form about safety.

## 14. Sporting Code Section 4 and related items. Report by CIAM Technical Secretary, Kevin Dodd

Mr Dodd reported that this year not as many records have been claimed as in previous years. Due to rule changes (for example the change of voltage limit for the batteries used), old records were retired in bulk. It has now become apparent that some of these records were set and fell within the current rules. This caused a lot of frustration to the record holders. In order to find a solution for all the individual dossiers from the retired records need revision. This constitutes a lot of work for FAI and CIAM.

Messieurs Metkemejier and Dodd will check if the old records need to be reinstated. They will contact FAI office for the original dossiers.

## 27. 2019 Drones World Championships and plans for 2020

Mr Delor was not attending the meeting as he was travelling to China as the Jury President at the 2019 WDRC. ASFC, the Chinese NAC expressed the intention to host the 2020 WDRC. Mr. Delor will be able to comment on this and do a formal recommendation after the evaluation of the 2019 WDRC. A Drone Soccer competition was organized in Korea as a side event to the Masters Series event.

## 28. Dealing with Ruling Authorities and future considerations

The proposals defined by the JARUS organization are treated as guidelines by all the national or regional authorities. Last July EASA rules were published and they will be implemented after a year.

Most of the countries ask registration for flying with UAVs. In many cases this also affects aeromodelling activities.

The CIAM President suggested discussing this matter at the Open Forum during the 2020 CIAM Plenary Meeting. Proposal was accepted.

### 29. Drones Permit to participate – concept

Some NACs complained about the "Drone Permit" scheme and they asked the FAI Secretariat EB to reconsider this decision and exclude them. They prefer the traditional FAI Sporting License concept.

The CIAM President informed that, he will be in contact with Mr. Delor and then with FAI EB to discuss the next steps. It is clear that the new scheme assisted a lot of participants to be in touch with FAI and Drone Sports while waiting for their NACs to introduce Drone Sports in their respective countries. It was also obvious that in some Asian countries the new scheme was more popular and was preferred by some NACs.

In addition, it was announced on the Sunday that the FAI EB reached a mutual agreement to terminate the contract with the FAI General Secretary, Mrs Susanne Schödel. Details will be provided by the EB.

It was also announced that Mrs Annick Hauser who worked as Assistant Sports Manager at FAI, will leave FAI on 22 December 2019.

The CIAM President and Bureau complimented and indicated their appreciation for Mrs Annick Hauser for her excellent work in FAI and her support with CIAM activities.

#### 32. Unsportsmanlike Behaviour in competitions

One Ukrainian competitor did not behave properly during the 2019 F1D European Championship.

During the F2C European Championship, a team refused to allow the officials to process the engine of the model, as per the provisions of the rules.

As CIAM President announced during the CASI Plenary, a decision was taken to establish a WG for harmonising the rules on this matter.

#### 33. F3A World Championship in Italy – Error in Ranking

A ranking error occurred due to a software error of the scoring program during the recent World Championships in Italy. Because of this, a competitor missed the opportunity to be on the final. This competitor happened to be the defending Junior World Champion from the previous event.

The CIAM President mentioned details about this case, since he was also a member of the Jury. Because the error was fully identified after the end of the event, by way of a solution, it was proposed that the participation of this competitor to the specific event as defending Junior WC was not completed and therefore he is offered the opportunity to be included as defending Junior WC at the next World Championship. The CIAM Bureau approved.

#### Activities

### 34. New identification of the Electric Pylon Racing class. Former was F5D and F3BE.

The CIAM President has concerns about the F3 class nomenclature, which very shortly will have no more letters free to be assigned to new classes. F5D could become F3E. Mr Metkemejier pointed out that it was not possible to accommodate on the same class rules for IC and electric engines/motors as it was the case for the F3T. Therefore, the F5D will be renamed as F3E and it will be served from now on from the RC Pylon Racing S/C.

It could be possible to change the numbering systems for the various classes based on the type of models instead of the type of control or of power plant.

## 35. Application for register Judges and Technical Experts

The CIAM President reported that the electronic registration of the Judges and of the Technical Experts was quite successful. 55 NACs used the application for registering 850 persons. No complaint or problems were reported.

#### 36. <u>Approval of the software used for competitions</u>

Based on the experience gained at the 2019 FAI F3A World Championship in Italy, the CIAM President proposed to proceed and approve any Software used during the CIAM competitions.

Mr Giezendanner proposed to present at the Plenary Meeting the list of the approved software. The CIAM Bureau approved.

It was noted that the Competition result reports are not following a standard template and are different from championship to championship. It was suggested that we need to establish some standards and to follow some rules.

The CIAM President would like to define a standard template for the result reports. This will be discussed in April.

The CIAM Bureau asked to withdraw the proposal and to leave the F2G class separated from F2A. A justification of that has to be prepared with evaluation and facts. The Control Line Subcommittee Chairman should provide the justification to the Technical Secretary.

"Unless specifically allowed in the class rules, any airborne device or function that uses sensors to actuate any control surface is prohibited and must not be installed. Receivers that transmit information back to the pilot-operated transmitter, are not considered to be prohibited devices, provided that the information that is transmitted is only for the battery, voltage or signal strength of the model aircraft, including model rocket gliders."

### 50. Any other business

### 50.1. Registration of Judges and Technical experts

The CIAM President asked if something is missing for the registration of the Judges and Technical Experts.

Mr Andras Ree mentioned that nomination from for Hungary are missing completely and there are some issues for Scale, Helicopters and Aerostats about Technical expert.

Mr Essing pointed out that the Technical Experts shouldn't be added without the permission of the relevant NACs. In fact, there are more than one technical expert from the same nation. It was explained that then it is up to the S/C chairman to decide who is to be included on the list.

#### 50.2. Scale Subcommittee proposal

The Scale Subcommittee Chairman suggested to remove (rephrase) some words about the high view of the judges contained in the Judges Guide.

The CIAM President propose to clarify this aspect at the 2020 Plenary Meeting with a proposal with immediate effect.

#### 50.3. Suggestion to increase the number of competitors at the CAT 1 events

The F3 RC Helicopter Subcommittee Chairman, proposed to increase the competitors at CAT 1 events not limiting them only to national teams. He suggested considering the best 10 pilots coming from the World Cup ranking.

The CIAM President suggested to think about it carefully because it will increase the effort of the CAT 1 events organisers. There are about 300 pilots not members of the NACs national teams. This proposal can be discussed next year and to propose a rule change at the end of 2020. Mr Dodd pointed out to keep always involved the NACs.

#### 50.4. Suggestion to use ADS-B devices

The third Vice-President informed that ADS-B devices are used for identifying the position of an aircraft like full size gliders. With a proper application, those devices can be used for evaluating the contest results of Gliders models as well.
