IGC-OLC World League-2016

The IGC-OLC World League concluded its 2016 season with 31,101,044 kilometres flown. Total activity for the OLC in 2016;

- PARTICIPANTS: 14,631 participants (a decrease of 2.51% from 2015),
- FLIGHTS: 116,510 flights (a decrease of .85% from 2015),
- TOTAL DISTANCE FLOWN: 31,101,044 kilometres (a decrease of 3.06% from 2015). Statistics from the OLC website (www.onlinecontest.org)
