<b>Details of the Judges Work: (including judging statistics)</b>	Competition on the grounds of the Cordoba Military Aviation School  Accuracy: judgment near the boarding area in a place clear of all obstacles (7 judges). 934 jumps (including 23 re-jumps)  Style: (7 judges) Style room in the area of landing gliders in a building with all sanitary facilities. The camera marker is located near the judges' building. 128 jumps (including 1 re-jump)  Vehicle made available to the Chief Judge
<b>Recommendations for Organisers:</b>	It was a first for the organization on this continent and they had no support from anyone.  Great difficulties have arisen concerning the manifest which was quickly overwhelmed by the fact of having two disciplines to manage at the same time with 3 planes.  Air traffic controllers did not help the competition by preventing them from flying or by including aerial demonstrations during our competition. Difficulties encountered in being in a military compound with military air control.

(a) The top 25% (minimum 10) male and female competitors (including juniors), after round 8 continue into the semi-final.  (b) The top 50%, male and female competitors (including juniors), placed in order.....the final round.</p>
Personal Remarks:	<p>This was my first position as Chief Judge during a FCE.</p> <p>This competition could be validated the minima required having been obtained at the end of the 4th day due to the bad weather conditions which presented themselves to us during the first 3 days.</p> <p>For the female the competition was completed as much in Team Accuracy with 8 rounds and an individual with 112 finale and finale as in style with 5 jumps.</p> <p>For the male we did the 10 jumps in accuracy but only 2 in style.</p> <p>No protests were filed during this competition regarding our judging work.</p>
