Competition:	1st FAI European Wingsuit Flying Championship 2019 3rd FAI World Cup of Wingsuit Flying 2019
Event(s):	Acrobatic and Performance
Location:	Ravenna, Italy
Dates:	August 23 - 31, 2019

Scoring Equipment Used:	Acrobatic; Omniskore: Performance; Omniskore; Ted Wagner was of great help and essential for the operation of Omniskore, SkyDerby was used for ratification.
Details of the Judges Work: (including judging statistics)	The Team of Judges worked very well as a team, showed great Work: initiative in assuming responsibility for the various tasks and duties and performed their work with great efficiency and attention to detail. All are to be congratulated. Acrobatic 28 jumps (0 rejumps), 3 training jumps Performance 453 jumps (including 3 rejumps), 100 Training jumps
Recommendations for Organisers:	The judging room was too small for both events and the air conditioner was not strong enough. Advise would be to use separate rooms and a separate dubbing station. Maximum temperature of 25 C inside the rooms.

Personal Remarks:	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The need for a Scoring Director is essential for a technical sport like WingSuiting. The days without Ted Wagner were difficult and caused unneeded issues with the scoring system. 2. We had one issue where a judge accidentally switched on a personal FlySight, this caused issues for the competitor. In the rules we are not responsible, we took additional checks to prevent this. 3. After the competition was approved by the IPC, the request for available judges was sent to the NAC's then there was a waiting time of 60 days. I could not start selecting judges before May 1 th. At this time some already had other plans. I would like to shorten the period to 30 days instead of 60 days for late entry events. 4. At the start of the event the arrival day was combined with the opening ceremony and already the next day was official training day. This combination gave us a short time to do Judges training for Acro and to instruct the judges for performance. 5. Team standings must be part of the judging system, this was not available during the competition.
