## 7.4 CISM REPORT

1 The 2015 CISM World Parachuting Championships is incorrectly noted as having Australia for its venue.

The correct location is Pohang, South Korea.

2 The statement 'The Australian Championships (2015) is fully booked up for teams' applies for the 2015 Championships in South Korea, where Military World Games will be held and only military teams from CISM members can participate. The 2014 CISM Championships in Solo, Indonesia, will have the ability to cater for observer teams of nations which are not CISM members.

Proposal, from Alberto Martin Paracuellos, IPC Delegate, Spain, to amend SC5 and the FAI Controller handbook accordingly so that each NAC must register their competitor in the following web page <a href="http://www.fai.org/about-fai/fai-sporting-licences">http://www.fai.org/about-fai/fai-sporting-licences</a> and it should be the responsibility of the FAI office to check that each competitor meets the specified requirements of representation in order to include them in the list.

This way the competitor would not need to bring the document to the competition and it could be checked on line, by the FAI Controller, well before the beginning of the event.

The Minutes of the 2014 IPC Plenary Meeting state -

'This proposal referred to Sporting Licences and their checking by the FAI Controller at FCEs. As it had been announced by the FAI Representative, Mr Rob Hughes, that paper Sporting Licence were being eliminated, and that in future the competitors credentials could be checked on the Sporting Licence Data Base, this proposal was redundant and was therefore withdrawn. The consequent change in the system will be reflected in the wording of SC5 1.2 (1) and the FAI Controller Handbook.'

Alberto Martin Paracuellos states that the Minutes are incorrect in this matter and that the proposal was carried by the Plenary.
