### 4.4 The Target

The target shall be a flat area where competitors' scores are measured. It is represented by a clearly marked circle with the automatic measuring device in the centre. Clearly marked circles must be set at $0.5 \mathrm{~m}, 2.5 \mathrm{~m}, 5 \mathrm{~m}$ and 10 m radius, centred on the dead centre. The marking of circles is indicative and not intended for scoring.

### 4.4.1 Target Size

The minimum radius of the target shall be 5 meters. Target size shall be stated in the Local Regulations. If the organiser wants to measure to less than 5 meters, this must be stated in the Local Regulations.

### 4.4 The Target

The target shall be a flat area where competitors' scores are measured. It is represented by a clearly marked circle with the automatic measuring device in the centre. ### 4.4.1 Target Size

The radius of the target shall be 5 meters. If the organiser wants to measure to less than 5 meters, this must be stated in the Local Regulations.

## Comment

Target size in category 1 events was discussed on Basecamp as a result of a suggestion in the Steward's report from the $5^{\text {th }}$ European Paragliding Accuracy Championships. At this competition a 5 m radius target was used together with the 2 cm spot on the electronic pad and it worked very well. The competitors in category 1 events are today very skilled, it is suggested that a 5 metre radius target is made the standard.
