BUREAU PROPOSAL – FAI AIR SPORT MEDALS

This medal was established by the FAI Council for the 100th anniversary of Lilienthal's first flights. It may be awarded, at any time, to individuals or groups for outstanding services in connection with air sport activities like work in FAI commissions, organizing World and Continental Championships, training and educating new pilots, or for promoting aviation in general, especially with regard to young people.

Award the FAI Air Sport Medal to the organizers of European and World Championships in 2016, in acknowledgment for their dedication to our sport, the hard work involved and the successful outcome.
