Proposal to add a terminology to the Internal Regulations for a common understanding and application of procedures, when making decisions at the IPC Plenary or any other group of the IPC, like IPC Committees, IPC-Bureau, IPC Extended Bureau, IPC Working group.

For IPC decisions the following terminology/procedures apply:

Absolute Majority: describes the situation where more than half of the votes (>50%) present or represented are needed for a decision.

Simple majority: describes the situation where more than half of the votes cast by eligible votes present, not counting abstentions, are needed for a decision.

Plurality: in a vote of more than 2 alternatives the decision shall be in favor of the alternative gaining the largest number of votes cast, not counting abstentions.

Decisive procedure:

- No absolute majority on the first vote leads to a simple majority or plurality voting procedure in a second vote.
- In a tie-situation in TWO (2) successive votes the IPC President shall cast the decisive vote.

Voting rights:

- Observer (Statutes) an individual invited to attend a FAI meeting but without the right to vote.
- IR 3.2.12 The Secretary may be chosen from outside the Commission, subject to agreement by the Member who would be responsible for issuing a Sporting Licence to the persons concerned as per FAI rights of representation (SGS 8.1.3.6)
- IR 3.2.14 The Secretary if not a delegate, shall have no voting rights.
- 3.3.6 Unless otherwise specified in Commission's Internal Regulations decisions shall be taken on an absolute majority vote,
