



1. Name of the Championship: 2020 Paragliding Pan-American Championchips

2. Location: Baixo Guandu (ES) - Brazil



Distances from major cities to Vitória:

- Rio de janeiro 550 km.
- São Paulo 1100 km.
- Belo Horizonte 530 km.

From Vitoria do Baixo Guandu: 180km by road

- **3. Proposal Date:** From 13th to 21st March 2020 after summer and beginning of the driest months: at the PWC SF 2018 that happened at the same proposed month we got 7 good tasks.



12. Test Event

The same team organized the 2018 Panamerican, 2017 Brazilian Nationals and 2015 PWC at the same place. 2019 Super Final will be held at Baixo Guandu later this year.

13. Launch Site:

Take off is about 110m long and 50m wide Is 850m over the valley and is faced to N-NE working like a big sun collector, even with a light moderate cross/ back wind we don't need to use other TO.

710m height above official landing which is 150m above sea level

The area is big enough to helicopter landing, car/ truck / bus parking. At last world cup realized April 2015 we got 3000 persons and 500 cars there.

The structure that we will provide is:

- Convenience store where you can buy food, water, soda etc...
- Bathrooms(4).



- 6 tents of 6x6m.

There is no obstacles around like cables, power lines etc.



14. Distance access to launch:

1 hours bus drive from town, or 45minutes by car, mostly in well maintained dirt roads Large parking area

Transport to launch will be provided by small buses and vans Gliders are transported in fully closed truck


15. Task flying area

Mainly flatlands, with small hills an rocks. The place is very friendly for flying competitions, we got only two areas that is not permitted to land, about 3 km radio, were is a hydroelectric power plant,


There is many roads around the area, asphalt and dirt roads.

16. Airspace

For the Panamerican 2018 NOTAM granted a ceiling at FL090, 2.000m above take off and a radius of 45km.





17. Weather

The area is not really affected to strong storms or wind


The cloud base usual is about 1500m agl raising up to 2800 m agl (valley level) later in the day. We recommend tasks with winds up to 20-25 km/h.


To make a parallel, the conditions are similar to Governador Valadares but more consistent and strong due the rocks around, the drier air and the convergence zone created by mountains

Rain statistics


The average rain at flying site is about 1000 mm year.

















18. Meteorology

Mr. Lucas Machado to provide the daily meteorological forecast. He provided the Meteorology forecasts for the Nationals, PWC and will provide for the SF 2019. Data collected from CPTEC, XCSkies INMET Ground Agricultural automated weather stations.

19. Transport

Vans or small buses to transport pilots to launch and for the retrieves, the gliders are transported with closed trucks.

Flymaster Telegramm system will be used and alternatively 2m band radio for the areas where ther is no telephone coverage, rescue coordinator stays at launch to be able to reach all competitors by radio. All vans/buses will have 2m band radios as well.



20. Safety issues:

We got some flats and mountains of granite reaching about 1000 m high, normally it is not a windy place, so no rotors. The area has many landing possibilities.

Power lines are a main issue and pilots must be careful when flying low in close to the terrain There was a fatality this year where shortly after launch due to a 50% collapse at low altitude pilot hit the ground. Live trackers were indispensible part of both the rescue effort and accident investigation, the results of which were debriefed at next pilot meeting. Two or three moderately blown launches.

21. Rescue and medical services

2 small ambulances available that can be driven on the dirt roads of the region

2 Paramedics and a doctor stby at takeoff

Helicopter Landing possible at launch area

We use fireman's brigade and a private rescue team contracted at event, all them with a full equipped cars as a intensive treatment (oxygen, defibrillator, medicines, and all them trained with a rescue at difficult areas(climbing), the helicopter is available in about 1h response, coming from Vitoria (about 100 km flying)

22. Safety Management Plan

In case of accident, we use the indicated FAI guideline

- Advise Regional ATC Centre and also local ATC organization.
- Insurance to cover liability, rescue charges, etc.
- Advise local police.
- Advise local ambulance, hospital and other medical services.
- Arrange medical doctor route to cover the event also to cover any post-mortem
- examination and inquest.
- Arrange site facilities, including a control room and incident room.
- Appoint officials: Event Director and Deputy Director, Event Safety Officer, Public Relations Officer.
- Investigate laws, rules and procedures that apply at the event site or sites, for accidents, injuries, fatalities and air accidents.

Make plans for dealing with accidents and incidents: release of names, control actions, incident log, official statements after the event, immediate actions, follow-up actions, dealing with press and media, witnesses, details of injured or deceased, National accident investigation procedures, continuance of event, facilities for victim's team, report to FAI; Injury, illness or death of participants or spectators

23. Transmissions

Radios: 2m band mandatory

Flymaster's proven Telegramm system will be used coupled with 2m band radio as a backup for areas without cellphone signal

Mobile/Cell Phone Coverage is limited, we advise pilots to use VIVO simcards:

24. Liaison with police

Local police give full support for this event and helped to make it safe for everyone

25. Insurance

No requirements have to be provided, just the mandatory from FAI comps.

The public health system in Brazil is free for all citizens and visitors however we strongly advise that every pilot have his own private insurance to guaranty a better treatment. For third part liability we for now recommend the AXA insurance that costs about 80 EU and provide for Europeans full coverage, for now Europeans cover the mandatory liability.

26. Event Headquarters:

We will use an auditorium as a headquarter (20x10m) at central square, and for the general pilot meeting will be held at the city cinema with capacity for 300 persons.

The headquarters will be equipped with a fast wifi (optical fiber available at city now), one fixed telephone line, air conditioning, beers All office equipment etc that is asked to organization to make the work of team easier.

27. Local facilities:



There are three main hotels in town, all them less them a kilometer from HQ, the prices range from 30 Euros PP with a double bed, breakfast and air conditioning, till 7 Euros at simpler dormitories.

We also have many hotels at Aimores city with similar prices 8 km from HQ.

28. Competition Website

29. Visas, Vaccinations:

VISA required for some countries, but not for Europeans or Latin Americans. Yellow Fever Vaccination obligatory for this area of Brazil

30. Early arrivals:

Up to 3 days before the event we will provide transport to the launch with a small fee paid directly to the driver; UBER services can also be used at any time. There are locals who fly almost every day.

31. Customs ad equipment importation

Must declare that it's personal equipment if asked by customs at airport of entry.

32. Medals etc

Will follow CIVL approach. With extra gifts not detailed at the moment.

33. Media coverage, publicity, sponsorship:

We plan to have a online broadcasted like surf events, it will be three cameras and one operator that chose the best one and also there is pre recorded images that complete the program.

Normally the media is very interested in paragliding in Brazil , anyway we have in the budget advertisement at 4 outdoors, radio , and TV. (About 6.000 Euros)






