# \*\*\*\*\* NOTE:

The discussion and voting about the 2014 FAI World Hot Air Balloon Championship started at this point and completed on the second day of the Plenary after item #21 of the agenda. For the sake of clarity all notes and voting are documented under this item in the Minutes.

Other than the 21<sup>st</sup> FAI World Hot Air Balloon Championship (2014) issue, there were no questions or comments about Bureau Actions during 2012.

There was considerable discussion and voting on the championship issue so only highlights of the comments will be presented in the minutes. Documents listed above were handed out to the delegates on the second day of the Plenary so they could see some of the correspondence between the CIA, FAI and Brazilian organizers.

- CIA President reviewed Bureau actions on Brazil sanctions
- Brazilian Delegate (Leonel Brites) said the original bid had a letter regarding transportation of balloons and the issue was discussed with the CIA President at the FAI Conference in Anatalya, Turkey
- FAI President (John Grubbstrom) FAI was asked, by the CIA, to write Breach of Contract letter concerning 3 points:
  - 1) City of Sao Carlos commitment to host the championship
  - 2) Transportation of the committed number balloons
  - 3) Brazil can submit a new sanction applications

Bureau asked Brazil to satisfy transportation volume gap and they made commitment for paying extra shipping costs.

FAI President again emphasised the legal implications of cancelling the sanction for the 21<sup>st</sup> World Championship.

- CIA President summarized communications issue with Brazil (PowerPoint presentation attachment 1i)
  - Sanction decision was made because time was needed to start the bid process for 2014
  - FAI satisfied contract commitment
- Czech Delegate ask for more transportation details
- Brazilian Delegate did not have more details other than balloons will be shipped from Frankfurt 3 days before the event and will be returned 1 week after the event.

 Canada: reminded the Plenary that the 2012 transportation commitment was for 70 balloons. Also Canada supports the Bureau actions to cancel sanctions

After further discussion a vote was called. There were a total of 30 votes in the Plenary. Absolute majority was 16.

#### MOTION 1 by the Chair

Do you wish to return the sanction for the 2014 World Championship to Brazil?

VOTE: Yes = 15, No = 13, Spoiled = 2 (No Majority so sanction will not be returned)

After further discussion:

**MOTION 2:** by Germany and Czech Republic

To vote again on Motion 1.

VOTE: Yes = 23, no -4, abstain -1 (Motion Carried)

#### **MOTION 3 by the Chair**

Return the sanction for the 2014 World Championship to Brazil.

VOTE: Yes = 14, No = 15, Spoiled -1 (No absolute majority - motion fails)

After further discussion more voting:

#### **MOTION 4 by the Chair**

Return the sanction for the 2014 World Championship to Brazil.

**VOTE:** Yes = 13, No = 15, Spoiled – 2 (No absolute majority - motion fails)

The Chair asked to switch to simple majority. According to the Commission Voting Rules (FAI Bylaws 3.3) if the tie vote continues the CIA President will decide.

#### **MOTION 5** by the Chair

The vote on this topic of the Brazilian sanction to be determined by a simple majority vote.

**VOTE:** Yes - 16, No - 13, Abstain - 1

#### **MOTION 6 by the Chair**

Return the sanction for the 2014 World Championship to Brazil.

VOTE: Yes = 15, No = 15, Spoiled = 0 (No majority - motion fails)

#### **MOTION 7 by the Chair**

Return the sanction for the 2014 World Championship to Brazil.

VOTE: Yes = 14, No = 16, Spoiled = 0 (Motion failed)

The result was, the Plenary decided to support the Bureau decision to cancel the sanction of the 21<sup>st</sup> FAI World Hot Air Balloon Championship in Brazil.

The Plenary moved on to the next agenda item

#### **Next Day of the Plenary Meeting**

The topic of the 21<sup>st</sup> World Hot Air Balloon Championship returned to the Plenary after agenda item #21 (Saturday March 23, 14:38)

On the second day of the Plenary the number of votes increased to 31 due to a proxy from Mexico to the USA being approved by the FAI President.

#### **MOTION 8 by the Chair**

To reconsider yesterday's motion and vote regarding the Brazilian issue.

VOTE: Yes 16, No 14, Spoiled -1

Further discussion included the following comments:

- Canada In regard to the FAI letter to Brazil. Has the FAI issued a letter stating conditions have been met?
   Is FAI satisfied conditions for Breach of Contract have been done but has not sent a letter?
- Sao Carlos City Representative spoke about event preparation in Sao Carlos and that they have a contract from the Brazilian Balloon Federation and FAI
- CIA President The FAI Organizer Agreement depends on approval of the sanction by the CIA.
  - If the Plenary returns the sanction to Brazil, then there will be no bid considered from Lithuania
  - The Lithuanian bid has not yet been signed by the FAI President, if he refuses to sign the result will be no event in Lithuania.
- Czech Republic If motion fails, will Brazil submit a bid against Lithuania The Brazilian reply was no!
- France According to the Brazilian delegates schedule, the balloons may be gone for a month.
- Luxembourg if balloons do not come on air force airplane, then the Brazilian Balloon Federation will transport all equipment back to Frankfurt.
- FAI Regional Vice President Flávio Oliva spoke:
  - He is sure the Brazilian Balloon Federation will meet all obligations
  - Brazilian Air Force supports these types of events
  - New central Brazilian government will be elected in October 2013
  - He is concerned about consequences about sports in Brazil if event rejected.
- France asked the question about the FAI Regional Vice President and who he represents.
- USA asked the Brazilian organisers if they would include other members of the Brazilian ballooning community such as Bruno Schwartz and Gabriela Slavec in their organisation. The Brazilian delegates said a definite no.
- USA Will the Brazilian Organisers put the competitors entry fees into an FAI escrow account and then
  would receive the entry funds after the completion of the event. The Brazilian delegate initially said no,
  but after discussing it with his delegation changed his mind and said yes.
- The Event Director for the 21<sup>st</sup> FAI World Hot Air Balloon Championship, Mathijs de Bruijn, commented that if he did not receive full cooperation from the Brazilian organisers he would resign his position.
- FAI President again emphasised the legal implications of cancelling the sanction for the 21<sup>st</sup> World Championship and would need to get a legal opinion if the breach of contract conditions had been met. He was of the opinion that the Plenary should reconsider its earlier decision to not return the event sanction to Brazil since the organisers were trying to meet all the conditions required.

#### MOTION 9 (March 23 - 15:30)

Return the sanction for the 2014 World Championship to Brazil.

**VOTE:** Yes - 17, No - 12, spoiled - 2 (motion carried)

Sanction returned to Brazil

#### Motion 1: SC S1 Procedures for championship entrants who fail to appear to be changed to read:

5.6.6.1 An entrant who fails to appear at an FAI World Air Games, World or Continental Regional Championship events defined as an entrant who is absent at the time of the roll call of the General Briefing of the event, without giving valid reason of force majeure (see note) before the time limits stated in 5.6.2.2, and has not been replaced by another competitor from the same NAC. An absent entrant shall be qualified "No-Show" only by decision of the International Jury.

Note: The event proposed as force majeure must pass three tests:

- 1. Externality: The entrant must have nothing to do with the event's happening
- 2. Unpredictability: If the event could have been foreseen, the entrant is obligated to have prepared for it. Being unprepared for a predictable event leaves the entrant responsible. Lack of resources (equipment, finances, crew, and time) is a typical example of things that can be prepared against, and cannot therefore constitute a valid reason.
- 3. Unpreventable: The consequences of the event must have been unpreventable (illness is only acceptable if the entrant can prove that his physical condition would have prevented him to exercise his pilot licence privileges during the event).
- 5.6.6.2. After the roll-call of the General Briefing and before publication of the official final entry list, the event director shall inform the Jury President of any entrant absent at the time of the roll call of the General Briefing of the event. The Jury must consider all available case-relevant information before qualifying an entrant as a "No-Show". The Jury's decision must be recorded in a written declaration to be published on the official notice board. A "No-Show" decision must be forwarded by the event director to the NAC concerned without delay.
- 5.6.6.3 A no-show entrant shall be prominently mentioned as such on the official entry list published after the General Briefing, or in case of a declared "No-Show", after the Jury's decision. He shall not be qualified as a competitor and shall not be considered in the ranking calculations.
- 5.6.6.4 A no-show entrant shall be disqualified from participating in any FAI Category 1 event for the rest of that year and an additional period of two calendar years. For the next event of the same type, a no-show's NAC will have its entitlement to entries reduced by the number of its no-shows in the previous event.

#### Motion 2: Proposal to amend the CIA Internal Regulations to allow for "selective" voting by adding:

When voting on a matter concerning only one Continental Region or a specific sub-class of aerostats, a preliminary voting round shall be performed where only delegates from the Continental Region concerned, or those who have declared being active in the concerned sub-class, shall participate.

The result of the preliminary voting round shall thereafter be confirmed by a final voting where all have the right to vote provided that they have voting rights according to BY-LAWS article 3.3.

Note: There is no rule in the FAI Statutes or the FAI By-Laws preventing the proposed procedure.
