

CIVL 2024 PLENARY – ANNEXE 23 ENVIRONMENTAL LIAISON OFFICER REPORT

Background

At Porto 2023 plenary, CIVL President expressed the wish to engage CIVL into dealing with environmental protection as concerns are currently really growing on such issues.

Thomas Sénac was nominated Environment Officer from Bill Hughes proposal.

The topic has been worked out in close connection with the Bureau along 2023.

A CIVL Green Charter / Environment Policy has been developed, in line with FAI environmental approach.

In this frame, the proposed strategy is, in a practical way; to propose to competition bidders and organisers to decide and implement relevant actions for promoting environmental protection during the preparation and the rolling out of the competition.

In order to help competition organizers in implementing this policy, a *self-assessment template* is made available, listing potential actions, associated with a score scale.

From the documented output of this template, in case a minimum commitment can be demonstrated (minimum overall score), a specific *logo 'CIVL Green commitment'* (still under design) can be used by the event organizer.

For **Cat 1 competitions**, a link to the bidding process will be implemented, referring to the developed environmental policy and related tool, as a part of the bid. (see revised Annex D)

Also, test-event and Event Steward reports will address specific conclusions towards those issues. After test-event, organizer will have to correct / improve identified failing practices.

Proposal

Endorsement and implementation of the proposed CIVL Environmental policy and associated tools (self-assessment template and logo),

with further publication in CIVL documentation.
