# International Parachuting Commission (IPC)

## 61st Plenary Meeting – Lausanne, Switzerland, 30 – 31 January 2010

### MINUTES

In the Chair: Graeme Windsor, IPC President  
Representing the FAI – Max Bishop, retiring Secretary General, FAI

#### 1. WELCOME AND ROLL CALL

1.1 IPC President Windsor called the 61<sup>st</sup> IPC Plenary Meeting to order at 10:00, Saturday, 30 January 2010, at the Mövenpick Hotel, Lausanne, Switzerland. President Windsor asked those in attendance to stand for a moment of silence in memory of the skydivers who died in the past year, and the death, after a long illness, of Josef Pavlata, former World Champion in Freefall Style and Accuracy Landing, was noted.

1.2 Mr Max Bishop introduced Mr Nicholas Imhof, Head of the Canton de Vaud Sport & Physical Education Service, who addressed the Plenary, welcomed the Delegates and thanked the Organisers for their work. Mr Imhof wished the meeting every success.

1.3 Mr Max Bishop, FAI, conducted the roll call of Delegates, noting apologies for absentees, approval of proxies, and verification of Delegates' authority. The roll call showed that 29 Delegates were present (**Annex A**) and the following four proxies were recognised:-

***Belarus to Russia***  
***Bulgaria to Poland***  
***Estonia to Finland***  
***Saudi Arabia to Egypt***

There were 33 votes in total, including the four proxies. These numbers indicated: - a simple majority - 17 votes; a two-thirds majority - 22 votes. The Delegates' attendance list was circulated for updating, and is attached as **Annex A**.

#### 2. CONFIRMATION OF MINUTES

2.1 The minutes of the 60th IPC Plenary meeting held in Västerås, Sweden, 31 January/01 February 2009 were published on the FAI/IPC website. They were corrected and amended as per *Annex 1* of the 2010 Plenary agenda.

The minutes, as amended, were approved by the Plenary.

#### 3. FAI ACTIVITIES REPORT & 103<sup>rd</sup> FAI GENERAL CONFERENCE

3.1 FAI Representative, Mr Max Bishop, presented an overview of both FAI activities in 2009 and the 103<sup>rd</sup> FAI General Conference, held at Incheon, Korea, 9<sup>th</sup>/10<sup>th</sup> October 2009. He praised the work of Ms Faye Cox and the large attendance at the ASIANIA meeting held at Incheon. The decision has been made by FAI to promote air sports more strongly in the Asian region. A Strategic Task Force has been established by FAI, to examine the strengths, weaknesses and other elements of the organisation and a report is expected soon. Mr Bishop spoke of progress made and noted the addition of the following as FAI members - Ecuador, Iran, Oman, Palestine, Qatar, Trinidad & Tobago, Azerbaijan, Mali, Mongolia, Moldova. In relation to the need for finance, including funds to meet FAI's future need to hire staff for Air Sports Commissions projects, it had been noted at the General Conference in Korea that IPC would need to consider this matter.

President Windsor responded and thanked Mr Max Bishop for his work for IPC over many years and for his support during that time. President Windsor noted that this was Mr Bishop's last IPC meeting as FAI Secretary General. Mr Stéphane Desprez, who was in attendance, was welcomed as FAI's new Secretary General.

**3.2 IPC President G. Windsor presented his report** (agenda *Annex 2*) to the 103<sup>rd</sup> FAI GC, regarding IPC activity in 2009. The German Delegate, R. Exi Hoenle, raised the question as to whether the World Games were a First Category Event and if not then perhaps we should consider having our own Air World Games.

The US Delegate, M. Laughlin asked where we were with WADA, the anti-doping agency. WADA had made rules regarding doping and FAI has until end of 2011 to be fully compliant, especially regarding testing, including out-of-competition testing.

The Netherlands Delegate, R. Overdijk, stated they had been asked to provide information for out-of-competition testing of athletes, which was very restrictive and onerous on people due to the conditions concerning availability for testing. They had supplied the names of the National Team only.

**3.3 FAI Air Sports Commissions Presidents' meetings** (agenda *Annexes 3 and 4*).

President Windsor remarked that the World Air Games brought all ASC Presidents closer and made for better co-operation and communication.

The German Delegate, R. Exi Hoenle, noted that there had been air traffic restrictions at Turin and this had created problems, that there had been four years to organize the event and that he was surprised the LOC (Local Organising Committee) did not adequately address this matter. He further stated that parachuting lost half its participants through this and it is not the way to go. President Windsor stated that a detailed analysis of the WAG, conducted by Jean-Marc Badan of FAI, pointed to this matter and the report also noted that lack of communication was a serious issue.

## **4. PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS**

### **4.1 President's Report**

President Windsor referred to his report (agenda *Annex 5*). He also noted that ARISF (Association of IOC Recognised International Sports Federations) had allocated funding to help development of Judge training in ASIANIA. US\$6,000 has been allocated over three years. A full-page skydiving photograph features in the attractive booklet produced by ARISF.

### **4.2 Strategic Plan**

President Windsor outlined the Bureau's work at its half-yearly meeting in Korea, where it developed proposed operational objectives (agenda *Annex 6*) for implementing IPC's Strategic Plan which was adopted at the last Plenary.

M. Bishop, FAI, stated that FAI will help on this issue. Swiss Timing, a company which conducts projects for IWGA, might be prepared to help regarding technical matters.

The German Delegate, R. Exi Hoenle, stated that the Strategic Plan was very good and he suggested that the timeframe should be publicised. He was advised that this was foreshadowed in the Bureau's plans, and that a draft press release was ready to be sent out, with reference to the Bid Book, if approval was forthcoming from the Plenary.

The US Alternate Delegate, Larry Bagley, asked what type of agreement would be entered into with a provider of a scoring system. In response, it was stated that the IPC aim was to have an agreement with a preferred supplier, guaranteed for three years, and during that time consider other options which might arise due to technological development. It was suggested that IPC might need more than one scoring system, as one might be better for a particular discipline than another.

The Canadian Delegate, R. *Buzz* Bennett, stated that IPC should go through this process, and ask providers to make submissions. Then IPC would choose one supplier for a contracted period and during that time event organisers would be obliged to use the chosen system and would pay for its use in any event they conducted – as per the Organiser Agreement. During the three-year period suppliers would again be asked to show what they had to offer and another three-year agreement would be entered into with a chosen supplier.

L. Bagley spoke against a three-year tied agreement, in case there were any problems with a chosen system and IPC might be unable to get out of the agreement.

R. *Buzz* Bennett stated that there may be several systems which will be endorsed by the Judges Committee. The Bureau will make a recommendation taking into account the Judges Committee evaluations, a contract will be entered into and if the supplier of the system does not meet the terms and conditions of the contract, the supplier would be in breach of the contract leading to the possibility of other systems being used.

R. *Exi* Hoenle expressed concern re the impact on a Competitor at a FCE of the cost of hire of a chosen scoring system. He suggested that perhaps portion of the membership fees paid to FAI be used to meet some of this cost.

G. Windsor stated that a three-year contract would contain fixed prices and thus prevent a supplier trying to take advantage of an organiser, which seems to have happened already, where there is no protection from a contractual agreement.

US Observer L. Hill noted that there could be slight differences in records on different systems. Finnish Delegate T. Tuominen stated that if a record is set according to our rules the question of the equipment is not an issue.

President Windsor asked the Plenary to proceed with the Scoring Systems Schedule Plan. He explained that the Bureau will not make a final decision or enter into a contract. The Bureau will select a preferred system and present a proposal/draft contract to the 2011 Plenary for approval.

Following discussion the meeting voted to adopt the IPC Strategic Plan Scoring System Schedule Plan, 23 voting for and 2 against.

#### **4.3 Championships Selection Process from Netherlands** (agenda *Annex 56*).

The proposal raised the issue of ranking and selection of team/competitors on a worldwide basis. Delegates expressed concern about selection and this possibly limiting attendance at FCEs. A ranking system was however considered a good idea. The meeting agreed to set up a Temporary Working Group to examine this issue. The Danish Delegate, Niels-Christian Levin Hansen will chair this Temporary Working Group and will report to the Plenary on Sunday 31<sup>st</sup> January 2010, with further details.

#### **4.4 Decisions by the Bureau**

President Windsor reported on the IPC Bureau's Interim Decisions during 2009, a list of which was included (agenda *Annex 7*). He noted that the Bureau had been busy during the year, with 30 decisions having been made.

R. *Exi* Hoenle stated that he felt that if there were four IPC officials present at a FCE they could make the decision as to whether the Security Deposit be refunded to the Organiser, thus cutting down on the Bureau's work.

He also queried the benefit to IPC of holding a mid-term Bureau meeting.

President Windsor answered the latter point and said we must at all times continue to move forward and develop in accordance with IPC's Strategic Plan, adopted by the Plenary at the last meeting. This action required the Bureau to act in a timely fashion and the meeting was the best way of achieving this.

U.K. Delegate John Smyth added that the Bureau had also taken advantage of meeting with the FAI Executive Board at the same time and a great deal had been achieved by doing this.

R. *Exi* Hoenle accepted this completely.

L. Bagley praised the President and the Bureau for the work done but stated that the Bureau needed to be careful in relation to making decisions. He further stated that the Sanction Fee had been previously set at 90 Euros, but perhaps that was now too high. There was the danger that the Bureau would think in terms of spending money purely because there was a good deal of it in hand.

President Windsor stated that finances would be discussed in the Finance Section of the agenda. The Strategic Plan had been accepted at the 2009 Plenary in Västerås, Sweden, but there was need to meet during 2009 to develop the implementation and operational details of the plan and lay down targets. He also stated that it was the Plenary, not the Bureau, which sets the level of the Sanction Fee, and the Plenary can change the fee from 90 Euros if it so desires.

The Bureau Interim Decisions were accepted by a majority of Delegates, with one abstention being noted.

Two additional Bureau Interim Decisions were made after the posting of the agenda on the web site. Decision No. 2009/31/11 dealt with Bureau approval of the Competition Rules for the 8<sup>th</sup> FAI WC & 5<sup>th</sup> European Championships in Para Ski, Predazzo, Italy, 09 – 14 March 2010. Decision No. 2009/32/12, was that agreeing to the repayment of the Security Deposit to South Africa re the 5<sup>th</sup> World Cup in Canopy Piloting. These decisions will appear in the agenda of the 2011 Plenary.

## **5. WORLD GAMES**

**5.1** Richard *Buzz* Bennett reported on the World Games in Chinese Taipei in 2009, as per *Annex 8* in the agenda. R. Bennett noted that this matter had been previously addressed in the Open Meeting and he now added that a deep debt of gratitude was due to all in the FAI office for their work, especially Ms Cosette Mast.

R. *Exi* Hoenle asked if FAI could recover some of the costs as air-to-ground did not work as expected. M. Bishop stated that this was not relevant to FAI as the cost of the air-to-ground was met by the Organisers.

### **5.2 Proposal re Non-compliance with World Games 2009 Canopy Piloting Rules (agenda *Annex 9*)**

It was noted that this matter had been explained at the Open meeting and had been dealt with, and the Delegate for Germany, as proposer, no longer wished to proceed.

## **6. WORLD AIR GAMES**

**6.1** First Vice President Gillian Winter reported to the Plenary (agenda *Annex 10*) on the World Air Games 2009, held in Turin, Italy. She thanked FAI and Jean-Marc Badan in particular for his great work regarding the WAG.

President Windsor advised that he had written to FAI President Pierre Portmann expressing regret at the very recent withdrawal of Odense, Denmark, as a potential host for the WAG in 2011. President Windsor's letter also stated:-

- that IPC supports the WAG, but that IPC must, at this Plenary, choose dates for its own 2011 events
- that IPC is concerned at the short lead-time for any 2011 WAG, bearing in mind that there is no host at present
- that IPC's view is that it is better not to have a WAG in 2011 than to settle for an event of a lower standard

ASC Presidents were copied into the IPC letter making this point.

M. Bishop, FAI, understood IPC's position and assured Delegates that the Commission's concerns would be respected.

## **7. GENERAL ISSUES**

**7.1 The Open Meeting** of 27 January was reported upon by President Windsor. The IPC Strategic Plan and associated matters were referred to, as was the report of Vice-President John Smyth on media matters.

It was further reported that the draft IPC Bid Book had been produced by First Vice President Gillian Winter and that Bid Book will be presented to the Plenary, under the Sporting Code Working Group section of the agenda, for approval.

Media matters - Flying Aces was reported as compiling and editing the material from the 5<sup>th</sup> WC of Canopy Piloting and this company was also working with Montenegro on media/publicity issues for the upcoming WPC in Style & Accuracy. The importance for IPC events of not clashing with the Olympics or the Para-Olympics was stressed, as there would be very little possibility of media coverage were such a clash to occur. J. Smyth will go to Montenegro with Flying Aces. In future, bidders for events will be required to appoint a Media Liaison Officer.

Committee Chairs have been asked to select athletes to provide biographies for publicity.

Safety – The Data Collection Tool was reported as working, thanks to the efforts of Elisabet Pettersson. Safety matters are and will be continued to be pressed forward, with the yearly Safety Report and other surveys conducted by the Technical & Safety Committee. The T&S Committee will continue to support those who are establishing and raising safety, technical and training standards in their own countries and regions.

World Games - IPC will take part in the World Games in 2013, even with reduced slots, and it is hoped that those South American countries which are active in parachuting will help IPC with the WG in Columbia.

Competition Rules harmonization - T. Tuominen stated that the Committee Chairs are working on this.

Protest Fee – The Protest Fee had been removed from the individual discipline Competition Rules and been put into Sporting Code Section 5.

**7.2 IPC Web Site.** Ms Susan Dixon referred to her report, (agenda *Annex 12*). President Windsor thanked Susan for her work. S. Dixon has met with Thierry Montigneaux of FAI, Elisabet Pettersson and Graeme Windsor, with a view to updating the IPC page on the FAI web site and making it easier to use and progress has been made on this. President Windsor asked that all Delegates make efforts to see that requests for information and for sporting profiles be responded to. President Windsor thanked S. Dixon for her very rapid posting of news on the IPC web site and expressed special thanks for her attendance at so many events.

### 7.3 International Military Sports Council - CISM

Jean Dermine's report, as CISM representative to the IPC, appears as agenda *Annex 13*. J. Dermine had left the meeting, due to another commitment, and there were no questions on his report. It was noted that attention is being paid to ensuring that IPC events do not clash with CISM events.

## 8. TECHNICAL AND SAFETY

**8.1** Technical & Safety Committee Chair, Liam McNulty, presented the T&S report for 2009 (agenda *Annex 14*), commented on the T&S Open Meeting, when the presentation on *Medical & Disability Considerations in Skydiving* had been given by Elisabet Pettersson and detailed the work of the T&S Committee for the coming year.

### 8.3 Annual IPC Safety and other reports

L. McNulty presented the 2008 Safety Report, commented on various matters and answered questions. This presentation was distributed to Delegates on CD, for use by the Technical & Safety Officers of their countries.

In addition to the Safety Report Presentation, the CD has:-

- the 2008 Safety Report
- the 2008 AAD Report and presentation
- the six Information Notices issued in 2009
- the forms and notes for the 2009 Safety and AAD reports
- the *Medical Requirements Survey Report*
- the presentation *Medical & Disability Considerations in Skydiving* by E. Pettersson
- the presentation *Data Collection Tool*, by E. Pettersson

### 8.2 Data Collection Tool

The presentation on this DCT was made by E. Pettersson, who demonstrated how to use the Tool and how to input information. Questions were answered and it was explained that each NAC would have its own user name and password. Confidentiality is assured as the Tool does not request names or locations of incidents/accidents. The Tool will be available for use in a week's time (from the Plenary), on the Technical & Safety page of the IPC web site. Countries were requested to use the Tool so that a large data base of incidents could be built up over a period, allowing for much valuable information to be extracted.

Elisabet Pettersson was thanked by acclamation for her work at the FAI office, in bringing the Data Collection Tool into an operational state.

## 9. FINANCE WORKING GROUP

**9.1** IPC Treasurer and Finance Working Group Chair, Richard *Buzz* Bennett, presented the financial statements for the year ended December 31, 2009, as per **Annex B** to these minutes. R. Bennett spoke on various financial matters, and reminded Delegates of the policy adopted some years ago of maintaining net assets at a minimum level of around €100,000 and that such funds would only be spent on projects of enduring long term benefit to IPC.

The level of the Sanction Fee was discussed and this will be noted when preparing the 2010 Budget (see below 9.2).

Regarding the matter of providing original receipts when making expense reimbursement claims to IPC – a matter of ongoing contention by claimants, M. Bishop, FAI, stated that this is a Swiss legal requirement and thus must be complied with. M. Bishop, in reply to R. *Exi* Hoenle stated that prints of electronic tickets are acceptable. As there were no proposals to amend the reimbursements procedure, the system now in use will be adhered to.

President Windsor thanked R. Bennett for his diligence and work.

**9.2 Budget for 2010** – R. Bennett asked for a deferral of this matter until later in the meeting. This was agreed to and the meeting approved the 2010 Budget on Sunday 31<sup>st</sup> January. See Item 21.2, Any Other Business, for further details.

## **10. FREEFALL STYLE AND ACCURACY LANDING**

**10.1** Committee Chair John Hitchen reported on the Committee's activities in 2009 (agenda *Annex 19*) and addressed the topics discussed by the Committee during 2009, in the S&A Open Meeting (agenda *Annex 21*) and in the Committee's closed meetings.

**10.2** The proposal from Denmark (agenda *Annex 22*) was withdrawn by the Danish Delegate, Niels-Christian Levin Hansen.

### **10.3 S&A Competition Rule Changes**

There were no Competition Rule changes for S&A and the 2010 Competition Rules would therefore be immediately sent to FAI for posting on the web site.

### **10.3 Future FCEs in Freefall Style & Accuracy Landing.**

#### **10.3.1 31<sup>st</sup> WPC and 5<sup>th</sup> Junior WPC in Freefall Style and Accuracy Landing, to be held at Niksic, Montenegro, 28<sup>th</sup> August – 04<sup>th</sup> September 2010.**

Delegates were asked to indicate intention by their countries to take part in this FCE. Indications were that the following would probably participate

- *Accuracy – male*                      12 teams
- *Accuracy – female*                    12 teams
- *Accuracy, Junior - male*              5 teams
- *Accuracy, Junior - female*          1 team

#### **10.3.2 Bid by Serbia to host 6<sup>th</sup> European Championships & 3<sup>rd</sup> Junior European Championships in S&A in 2011.**

The S&A Committee supported this bid and a majority of more than two-thirds of the Delegates agreed to place the bid, a late bid, on the Plenary agenda.

The General Secretary of the Serbian Aero Club, Mr Željko Ovuka, presented the bid.

On a vote being taken there was one abstention, no vote against, and the majority was thus in favour. The bid was therefore successful, subject to the application fee being paid. The original dates, in July, were changed so that the event would not clash with CISM.

This event will now take place at Kikinda, Serbia, from 18<sup>th</sup> – 28<sup>th</sup> August 2011.

#### **10.3.3 Italian Bid to host 32<sup>nd</sup> WPC in S&A at Belluno, Italy, in 2012.**

The S&A Committee supported this bid, see Letter of Intent (agenda *Annex 20*), subject to it not being in conflict with the Strategic Plan's aim to hold a Mondial in that year.

## **11. FORMATION SKYDIVING**

**11.1** Committee Chair Fiona McEachern reported on the Committee's activities in 2009, (agenda *Annex 23*) and addressed the topics discussed by the Committee during 2009, in the FS Open Meeting (agenda *Annex 25*) and in the Committee's closed meetings.

### **11.2 Chief Judge Report, 16<sup>th</sup> WC & 9<sup>th</sup> EC in FS, Prostějov, Czech Republic, 2009.**

The report of the Chief Judge, FS, Rina Gallo, was presented (agenda *Annex 24*). There were no questions and the report was accepted.

**11.3 19<sup>th</sup> WPC in FS Menzelinsk, Tatarstan, Russia, 29<sup>th</sup> July – 06 August 2010**

Draft Bulletin No. 0 was distributed. The Russian Delegate, Vladimir Gazetov, stated that it was very important to contact the organiser before 16 June 2010 to make arrangements regarding transport and to make bookings.

Delegates were asked to indicate intention by their countries to take part in this FCE. Indications were that the following would probably participate

- 4-way FS 15 teams
- 4-way Female 8 teams
- 8-way 8 teams
- 4-way VFS 7 teams

**11.4 Future FCEs in Formation Skydiving****11.4.1 Germany presented a late bid to host a World Cup in FS and AE in 2011.**

This late bid received the necessary two-thirds vote of Delegates in favour, to allow it be placed on the agenda. The bid was deferred for discussion until the Artistic Events section was due for discussion (see 13.4.1 below).

**11.5 FS Competition Rules Changes** – The FS Committee Chair, F. McEachern, presented changes to the FS Competition Rules for 2010 in the following - 2.2; 3.3.6; 3.3.7; 3.3.8; 3.3.9; 4.5.2; 4.5.3; 6.1; 6.6; VFS Dive Pool Clarifications – Block 2 and Random F. These proposals were approved unanimously and will be in the 2010 FS Competition Rules, which will be posted on the FAI web site.

The proposed rule change regarding competitors being in both FS and VFS at the same competition was withdrawn.

**12. CANOPY FORMATION**

**12.1** Committee Chair Marylou Laughlin reported on the Committee's activities in 2009, (agenda *Annex 26*), thanked the members and advisors of the CF Committee and addressed the topics discussed by the Committee during 2009, in its Open Meeting (agenda *Annex 27*) and in the Committee's closed meetings

**12.2 CF Web Challenge.**

The name shall be changed to 'FAI/IPC Canopy Formation Web Competition'. The canopy kindly donated by Aerodyne, was won by a member of the French team.

The CF web competition will resume for 2010 and the deadline is 15<sup>th</sup> July.

There will be more promotion for this competition, especially through the web site

**12.3 Future FCEs in CF****12.3.1 14<sup>th</sup> WPC in Canopy Formation, Menzelinsk, Tatarstan, Russia, 29 July – 06 August 2010**

Delegates were asked to indicate intention by their countries to take part in this FCE. Indications were that the following would probably participate

- 4-way sequential CF 8 teams
- 2-way sequential CF 11 teams
- Rotation 6 teams

### 12.3.2 15<sup>th</sup> WPC in Canopy Formation.

Italy indicated, by a Letter of Intent accompanied by supporting letters from the City of Belluno, the Province of Belluno and the region of Veneto, that it will bid to host this WPC, at Belluno, Italy, in summer 2012. President Windsor thanked Italy for this and stated that it was in line with IPC's Strategic Plan of moving towards the Mondial concept, as Italy will bid to hold the 32<sup>nd</sup> WPC in S&A (see 10.3.3 above) at the same location in 2012.

### 12.4 Proposed changes to the Canopy Formation Competition Rules

Committee Chair M. Laughlin proposed the Competition Rule changes:- 4.9.2; 4.9.3 and 4.9.7. These changes were approved unanimously. The changes will be incorporated into the CF Competition Rules for 2010, which will be posted on the web site.

## 13. ARTISTIC EVENTS

**13.1** Committee Chair Ronald Overdijk reported on Committee activities for 2009 (agenda *Annex 28*). He thanked the Czech Republic for conducting an excellent competition – the 7<sup>th</sup> WC and 6<sup>th</sup> EC in AE, held at Prostejov, Czech Republic in 2009.

### **13.2 Chief Judge Report - 7<sup>th</sup> WC and 6<sup>th</sup> EC in AE, Prostejov, Czech Republic, 30 Aug – 06 Sept. 2009.**

The report of the Chief Judge, Alia Ananina, (agenda *Annex 30*) was referred to. There were no questions and the report was accepted unanimously.

### **13.3 8<sup>th</sup> WPC in Artistic Events, Menzelinsk, Tatarstan, Russia, 24 July – 02 Aug. 2010**

Delegates were asked to indicate intention by their countries to take part in this FCE.

Indications were that the following would probably participate

- *Freestyle* 3 countries
- *Freeflying* 7 countries

R. Overdijk expressed disappointment on these low numbers.

### **13.4 Future FCEs in Artistic Events**

**13.4.1** The bid from Germany (see 11.4.1 above) was presented by the German Delegate, R. Exi Hoenle. The proposed dates were 28 July – 07 August 2011. Questions were asked re jump prices, aircraft to be used and the judging system. The judging system was an issue, as to whether it would be an IPC-approved system or whether another system might be used. It was pointed out that the time schedule for the IPC-approved judging system would mean there will be no FAI contractual obligations in this regard for 2011. The AE Committee indicated its support for this bid, as also did the FS Committee. The €1600 fee has been paid in cash to the FAI by the German Delegate. The bid was unanimously accepted and the bid presentation is attached as **Annex G** to these minutes.

### **13.5 Proposed changes to the AE Competition Rules**

Committee Chair R. Overdijk proposed and discussed amendments to the Competition Rules, arising from AE Committee meetings held prior to the Plenary.

Rules changes:- 4.6.2; 5.6.1; 5.7.1; 5.7.2; 5.7.5; 5.10.2.1, 5.11.3; 5.8; 6.5.4; 5.10.1.1.

The Plenary voted unanimously to accept these rule changes. The changes will be incorporated into the AE Competition Rules for 2010, which will be posted on the web site.

## **14. PARA SKI**

**14.1** There were apologies for his absence, due to illness, from the Committee Chair, Michael Egger. Committee Deputy Chair, The Alternate Delegate from The Netherlands, Henny Wiggers, reported on the Committee's activities in 2009 (agenda *Annex 32*) and on the 12<sup>th</sup> WPC in Para Ski held at Donnersbachwald, Austria, 10-15 March 2009. This was an excellent event and the Report of the Chief Judge, Ulf Tingnert, (agenda *Annex 33*) was accepted by the meeting.

### **14.2 Future FCEs in Para Ski**

**14.2.1** The Italian Alternate Delegate, Alberto Notari, updated the Plenary on the 8<sup>th</sup> World Cup & 5<sup>th</sup> European Championships in Para Ski to be held at Predazzo, Italy, 09<sup>th</sup> – 14<sup>th</sup> March 2010.

**14.2.2** The Austrian Delegate, Johann Gritsch, put forward a bid to host the 13<sup>th</sup> WPC in Para Ski at Gosau, Austria in 2011 (agenda *Annex 34*). The Para Ski committee supported the bid with the remark that entry fees were high. This bid was accepted, with one abstention.

**14.2.3** H. Wiggers asked Delegates to submit bids to host a World Cup in Para Ski in 2012, and competitions in other years. There were presently two countries interested but no bids had been received to date. Russia expressed interest in hosting a WPC in 2013 and 2014, and intends using the WPCs to try to bring Para Ski closer to the Winter Olympics. Two WPC's after each other would also bring Paraski in line with the WPC schedule of the other competition disciplines.

The Para Ski Committee reported that it is working on trying to have Para Ski accepted as a Demonstration Sport at the Winter Olympics, and to help with this Mark Potapov of Russia had been recruited as an Observer on the Para Ski Committee.

### **14.3 Proposed changes to the Para-Ski Competition Rules**

It was reported that the scoring pad becomes too stiff from the cold, especially the back-pad. The Committee is working to have a heated pad developed, or some method of scoring more accurately. Any development will be tested before its use is proposed for adoption.

The Committee will investigate the possibility of 2-way teams for Female and Junior competitions, to allow countries with lesser activity in Para Ski to have a better opportunity to participate in competitions.

It was proposed that the accuracy disk be changed from 3 cm diameter to 2 cm, with 5cm steps in the pad. This rule change was approved unanimously and will take effect in 2011. The changes will be incorporated into the Para Ski Competition Rules 2010, which will be posted on the web site.

**14.4** President Windsor thanked H. Wiggers for standing in for Michael Egger and was glad to note that M. Egger is improving. He also complimented H. Wiggers for looking far ahead with the Winter Olympics and Russian involvement in working towards that goal.

## **15. CANOPY PILOTING**

**15.1** Committee Chair Thomas Tuominen reported on the Committee's activities in 2009 (agenda *Annex 36*). He commented on the 5<sup>th</sup> WC in Canopy Piloting, held in South Africa in December 2009 and he was pleased to state that this competition was excellently organized and well run. The reports of the Chief Judge, M. Laughlin (agenda *Annex 37*) and the FAI Controller, T. Tuominen, (agenda *Annex 38*) were attached and were accepted.

**15.2 Russian Bid to host 3<sup>rd</sup> WPC in Canopy Piloting, at Kolomna, Russia.**

The Russian Delegate, Vladimir Gazetov, spoke to the bid to host the 3<sup>rd</sup> WPC in Canopy Piloting at Kolomna, Russia, 07<sup>th</sup> – 15<sup>th</sup> August 2010. Delegates voted in favour of accepting this bid, with one abstention.

Delegates were asked to indicate intention by their countries to take part in this FCE. Indications were that the following would probably participate

- *Countries* 14
- *Countries with more than 5 competitors* 5

**15.3 Future WPCs, World Cups, and other First Category Events**

Brazil expressed an interest in bidding for a future FCE.

**15.4 Proposed changes to the Canopy Piloting Competition Rules**

Committee Chair T. Tuominen proposed and discussed amendments to the Competition Rules, based on the Committee's deliberations held prior to the Plenary meeting.

Rule changes:- 4.3.2; 4.8; 4.9.1; 5.6; 5.7; 5.9; 6.4; 6.5; 7.9; 7.10; 9.1; 9.2; 9.3.4; 10.2.4.

The Plenary voted unanimously to accept these rule changes. The changes will be incorporated into the CP Competition Rules for 2010, which will be posted on the web site.

**15.5** President Windsor acknowledged the big workload of the CP Committee and the work of T. Tuominen during the year to develop the CP rules.

**16. FAI JUDGING**

**17.1** Committee Chair Pia Berggren reported on the Committee's activities in 2009 (agenda *Annex 42*) and thanked members and advisors for their work.

P. Berggren stated that in future an online training course will be mandatory for aspiring Judges before they will be admitted to a training course. The Committee is trying to establish an easier way to re-validate Judges' ratings and is currently working on the matter.

**17.2 Chief Judges for 2010**

Committee Chair P. Berggren proposed as Chief Judges for 2010 FCEs and Para Ski 2011.

These nominations were approved unanimously by the Plenary.

**17.3 Nominations of Judges for 2010 FCEs and for Para Ski 2011**

These nominations are to be sent to the Chair of the Judges Committee, P. Berggren, by 28 February 2010.

**17.4 Rule changes** – There was one change:- 4.1.4. (3), proposed by the Judges Committee and this proposal will be brought forward during the Sporting Code discussions.

It was also proposed that there be an exception to the rules for this year only, to allow a reduction, to 9, in the number of Judges allowed for the 8<sup>th</sup> WPC in AE at Menzelinsk, Tatarstan, Russia. Rule 4.6.6 (2) would be affected. This matter was tested at the WC in 2009 and found acceptable. This proposal, being an exception for 2010 only, was dealt with at this stage, rather than at the Sporting Code discussions. The Plenary accepted this proposal, with one abstention.

#### **17.5 FAI Judges List**

The list of FAI Judges for 2010 was verified, per updates sent to Judges Committee Chair P. Berggren, and is attached to these minutes as **Annex D**.

#### **17.6 Wingsuit Records Working Group**

There was a proposal to establish a Temporary Working Group, with the South African Delegate, Jacqui Bruwer, as Chair, to examine the Wingsuits Large Formation Records issue. J. Bruwer proposed the membership of this Working Group (for membership of this WG see **Annex F**)

The US Alternate Delegate, L. Bagley, was tasked with writing the Working Group's Terms of Reference and these will be incorporated into the 2010 Internal Regulations.

The Norwegian Delegate, Pål Bergan, stated that the Terms of Reference should be wide enough to focus on other possible developments in the area of unlinked formation flying and other parachuting disciplines, and not focus exclusively on Wingsuit Flying.

This Temporary WG will report to the Plenary in 2011.

The Plenary voted to establish this WG, by majority vote, with two abstentions.

#### **17.7 Proposal from France re Camera Standards**

This proposal from France (agenda *Annex 45*) was withdrawn by the French Delegate, G. Winter, as the matter had been addressed by the Judges Committee and the relevant competition committees.

### **18 SPORTING CODE & IPC INTERNAL REGULATIONS**

**18.1** Ms Gillian Winter, Chair of the Sporting Code Working Group, presented amendments to the Sporting Code, Section 5 (agenda *Annex 46*), and to the Internal Regulations (agenda *Annex 47*). With the exception of the items, addressed below, the remainder of the proposals were accepted unanimously.

**18.1.1** *Annex 46*, page 2,

**4.1.2 (4) Where an Organiser makes an application (in accordance with the FCEAD) to host WPCs that together comprise a Mondial 1.1.2(10)), the IPC Plenary will act as follows;**

**(1) A vote will first be taken on whether to approve, as one complete package, all the WPCs comprising the Mondial**

(2) If the complete package approval in (1) is not given, each WPC hosting application, referred to in (1), ***if not withdrawn***, will be considered separately, discipline by discipline (1.1.1(4)), together with any other valid WPC applications for each particular discipline.

These changes to 4.1.2 were adopted unanimously

**18.1.2** *Annex 46*, pages 3

4.7.1.10) All travel **(to and from the Jury Member's normal place of residence)**, accommodation... The insertion of this addition, between brackets above, was accepted by the meeting.

**18.1.3 Annex 46, page 4**

4.7.1.10) The proposal was to insert the following text into 4.7.1. 10) **Any Jury Member expense claim form that is received by the IPC Treasurer more than 90 days after the FCE, in which the Jury Member served, officially ends will not be paid. Any claim form is deemed not to be received by the IPC Treasurer until all necessary receipts, documentation and approval signature are provided.**

After discussion, this 90-day limitation proposal for the Jury, and for Judges, was withdrawn.

**The IPC Plenary then adjourned until the morning of Sunday 31 January 2010**

2.17 – add ‘Appoint Media Officer’

2. 21 – new sub-section with Medical Requirements listing

2.22... "plus, when applicable, CP Technical Course Director and Media Officer"

2. 23 – On-site communication details added

The total document, with changes, was accepted unanimously.

**18.3 Bid Book**

The Chair of the SCWG, G. Winter, brought forward the matter of the draft Bid Book for discussion. The document, which lists the details of parachuting events, the criteria, conditions and requirements for hosting same, and the benefits accruing, was posted on the web site on 8<sup>th</sup> January 2010. Hard copies were distributed at the Plenary. There were no suggestions or proposals for change to the document, which was accepted unanimously.

**18.4 IPC Internal Regulations**

The Chair of the SCWG, G. Winter, brought forward proposed changes to the Internal Regulations (agenda *Annex 47*). A major change is that awards will henceforth be made in the same year as the nomination is approved, thus eliminating the year’s delay which heretofore was the rule.

The changes proposed were adopted unanimously with immediate effect.

**18.5 IPC Internal Regulations, Annex 6 (Hosting of an IPC Plenary Meeting)**

The Chair of the SCWG, G. Winter, brought forward proposals to amend this section of the IRs (agenda *Annex 48*). There was one change to the proposals:-

3. *Technical Workroom* – ‘*This workroom should have at least one computer and a network colour printer.....*’ (the word ‘colour’ was added)

With this one change the proposed document was adopted unanimously.

**18.6 Proposal to amend IPC Internal Regulations**

A proposal (agenda *Annex 50*) for the development of amendments to the IPC Internal Regulations, was withdrawn by the German Delegate, Rainer *Exi* Hoenle.

**18.7 USA Notice of Intent to propose addendum to SC5 (Largest Wingsuit Formation)**

This matter had already been taken care of, by the establishment of a Working Group, see 17.6 above.

**18.8 List of Jurors.** The Chair of the SCWG, G. Winter, presented the list of Jurors for 2010 and advised the Delegates of those who, under the rules adopted this year, are being taken off the list. These were the twelve people on the List of Jurors who had not been to the IPC Plenary meetings for three years and they were therefore removed from the List of Jurors.

There were six additions to the list –Günter Berendt, Jacqui Bruwer, Larry Hill, Lindy Rochow-Williams, Trude Sviggum and Henny Wiggers.

The 2010 list of Jurors was presented to the Plenary for approval and was unanimously approved.

The 2010 Juror list is appended as **Annex E**.

**18.9** The nomination of Juries and FAI Controllers for FCEs in 2010 and some 2011 appointments was presented to the Plenary and the motion to approve the list was passed unanimously.

President Windsor thanked the Sporting Code Working Group, specifically Chair Gillian Winter and Secretary Richard *Buzz* Bennett for the very big workload they had undertaken during 2010.

## **19. ASIANIA**

ASIANIA Secretary, Ms Faye Cox, presented the report on ASIANIA activities in 2009, and delivered apologies on behalf of Mubarak Swilim al Swilim, ASIANIA President, for his inability to attend the Plenary.

F. Cox noted in her report the progress made during 2009 and referred to the fact that ASIANIA had grown from 6 countries in 1994 to 27 in 2009. She thanked IPC for its continued support and also thanked IPC and FAI for securing funding of US€6,000, over three years, for Judge training programmes. The report concluded with an outline of the full programme of work scheduled for 2010.

President Windsor thanked Faye Cox for her report and congratulated ASIANIA on the wonderful progress it had made and on its excellent meeting at Incheon, Korea, where it had established good links with FAI. The FAI resolution at its General Conference was noted, that it had decided to focus on the development of Air Sports in Asia and this was promising for the future.

## **20. AWARDS**

### **20.1 FAI Gold Parachuting Medal**

The nomination of Patrice Girardin for this award was made and was accepted at the 2009 Plenary. The French Delegate, Gillian Winter, asked Delegates to approve the award to Patrice Girardin and Rainer *Exi* Hoenle asked for a vote. The Plenary voted in favour of the award being made to Patrice Girardin.

USA Alternate Delegate, Larry Bagley, asked that President Windsor contact Patrice Girardin as soon as possible to advise him of the award, and this was agreed.

### **20.2 Leonardo da Vinci Diploma**

There were two nominations for this award. Canada had nominated Barry McAuley (agenda *Annex 54*) and UK had nominated Andy Pook (agenda *Annex 53*).

Barry McAuley, the Canadian Alternate Delegate, left the Plenary meeting while this matter was being discussed.

The UK Delegate, John Smyth, withdrew the nomination of Andy Pook and stated that the UK may consider his nomination in the future.

The Canadian Delegate, Richard *Buzz* Bennett, thanked the UK for this generous gesture of withdrawal of its nominee and he then listed the skydiving record, work and qualifications of B. McAuley, and he proposed Barry McAuley as a highly suited candidate for the award. A secret ballot was taken.

The result was a unanimous decision in favour of the Leonardo da Vinci Award being made to Barry McAuley.

### **20.3 Faust Vrancic Medal**

There were no nominations to the 2010 Plenary for this award.

President Windsor reminded Delegates of the prestige and publicity opportunities associated with bestowing FAI/IPC awards on eligible nominees and he encouraged Delegates to consider greater use of the awards available.

## **21. ANY OTHER BUSINESS**

### **21.1 Ranking System Working Group**

Niels-Christian Levin Hansen was appointed Chair of this Working Group and he produced Terms of Reference. The members of this WG are listed on **Annex F**.

This is a Temporary Working Group and it will make a mid-term report to the Bureau.

**21.2 2010 Budget.** (See Finance 9.2) The proposed budget for 2010 was presented by the Chair of the Finance Working Group, Richard *Buzz* Bennett. R. Bennett worked through the proposed budget, explaining the details.

An allocation of 1,000 Euros has been made to all Committees that did not submit spending requests, and applications to spend amounts over that are subject to separate application to and approval from the Bureau.

The proposed 2010 Budget shows a deficit, which arises from a conservative estimate of income and an over-estimate of expenditures in line with the Treasurer's consistent approach.

If there is a deficit in 2010, IPC will be close to the 100,000 Euro minimum balance referred to in 9.1 above, and a thorough review of IPC financial policy will be needed for 2011.

The necessity of a Bureau mid-year meeting, and the circumstances that require it, were questioned. It was pointed out to R. *Exi* Hoenle that a decision will be made during the year on whether the Bureau will need to meet face-to-face or by teleconference, and if it is deemed that a meeting is not necessary then one will not be held. President Windsor pointed out the achievements of the Bureau to date in producing and implementing the Strategic Plan, and the fact that all other FAI Commissions surveyed find a need to conduct mid-year Bureau meetings.

On a vote taken the Budget was approved with one abstention.

President Windsor thanked R. *Buzz* Bennett for all his work on the IPC finances.

For the 2010 Budget see **Annex C**.

### **21.3 Leonardo da Vinci Award – Expansion of criteria for making the award**

The Australian Delegate, Fiona McEachern, proposed that the SCWG review the criteria for this award, to bring it up-to-date to cover all disciplines, and that the Bureau be empowered to propose the changes to the FAI General Conference in 2010.

This proposal was agreed unanimously.

## **22. CONFIRMATION OF THE COMMITTEES AND WORKING GROUPS**

**22.1** The Bureau presented the list of Committee and Working Group Chairs, Members and Advisors to the Plenary for approval. This list was approved unanimously. The approved list is attached as **Annex F**.

### **22.2 Confirmation of the IPC World Air Games Liaison Officer**

The IPC Bureau proposed Gillian Winter for this role.

The Plenary voted to accept this nomination.

### **22.3 Confirmation of the FAI World Games Liaison Officer**

It was agreed that R. *Buzz* Bennett, who had drawn together documents from Kaoshiung, would temporarily hold this position. R. Bennett stated that he was willing to hand over, but that it was important that the collected data and experiences be passed on.

Ronald Overdijk, being a Spanish speaker, was proposed by R. *Exi* Hoenle. R. Overdijk agreed to fill this position.

President Windsor suggested not making any immediate decision and waiting until IPC had more information on the proposed WG in Colombia, and in the meantime R. Bennett would continue to work on the material he was gathering. G. Windsor further noted that there were decisions to be made by FAI re the WG at Cali, Columbia and that IPC was not sure of what its participation in these WG will be.

The Plenary voted to accept this course of action.

The Montenegro Delegate, Zoran Lakic and the Alternate Delegate, Predrag Amidzic, presented a bid to host the 62<sup>nd</sup> IPC Plenary Meeting in Bar, Montenegro, 25<sup>th</sup> – 30<sup>th</sup> Jan 2011, with an additional day being included for the meeting of the Bureau and Committee and Working Group Chairs.

The Montenegro Delegate provided the following additional details:

- a. Additional days would cost 70 Euros per person per day.
- b. There would be sufficient rooms for meetings (the original bid stated two).
- c. The distance for Podgorika Airport to Bar is 50 km and the approximate cost by car is 13 Euros.
- d. Montenegro could meet any new requirements set by the 2010 Plenary regarding the hosting of a Plenary meeting.
- e. A room would be provided for the Bureau meeting of Tuesday 25<sup>th</sup> January 2011

It was noted that the Belgium Delegate had left, and there were now 29 votes, thus a two-thirds majority would be 20.

On a vote being taken the Montenegro bid was accepted unanimously.

**24.2** Argentina declared its intention to bid to host the 63<sup>rd</sup> IPC Plenary Meeting in Buenos Aires in 2012 and will present the bid in Montenegro in 2011.

G. Windsor thanked Argentina for indication of its intention to bid to host the 2012 Plenary in Buenos Aires, welcomed Mr Berriolo back to IPC after a long absence, and stated that IPC looks forward to receiving the Argentinean bid in 2011.

**25. ADJOURNMENT**

President Windsor thanked the Delegates for their work and attention during the Plenary. He also thanked the FAI staff, Mr Max Bishop, Ms Christine Rousson, Ms Cosette Mast,

Mr Jean-Marc Badan and Mr Thierry Montigneaux, all of whom had worked hard to make the 61<sup>st</sup> IPC Plenary meeting successful. Special thanks were extended to Ms Cosette Mast who had organized the meeting.

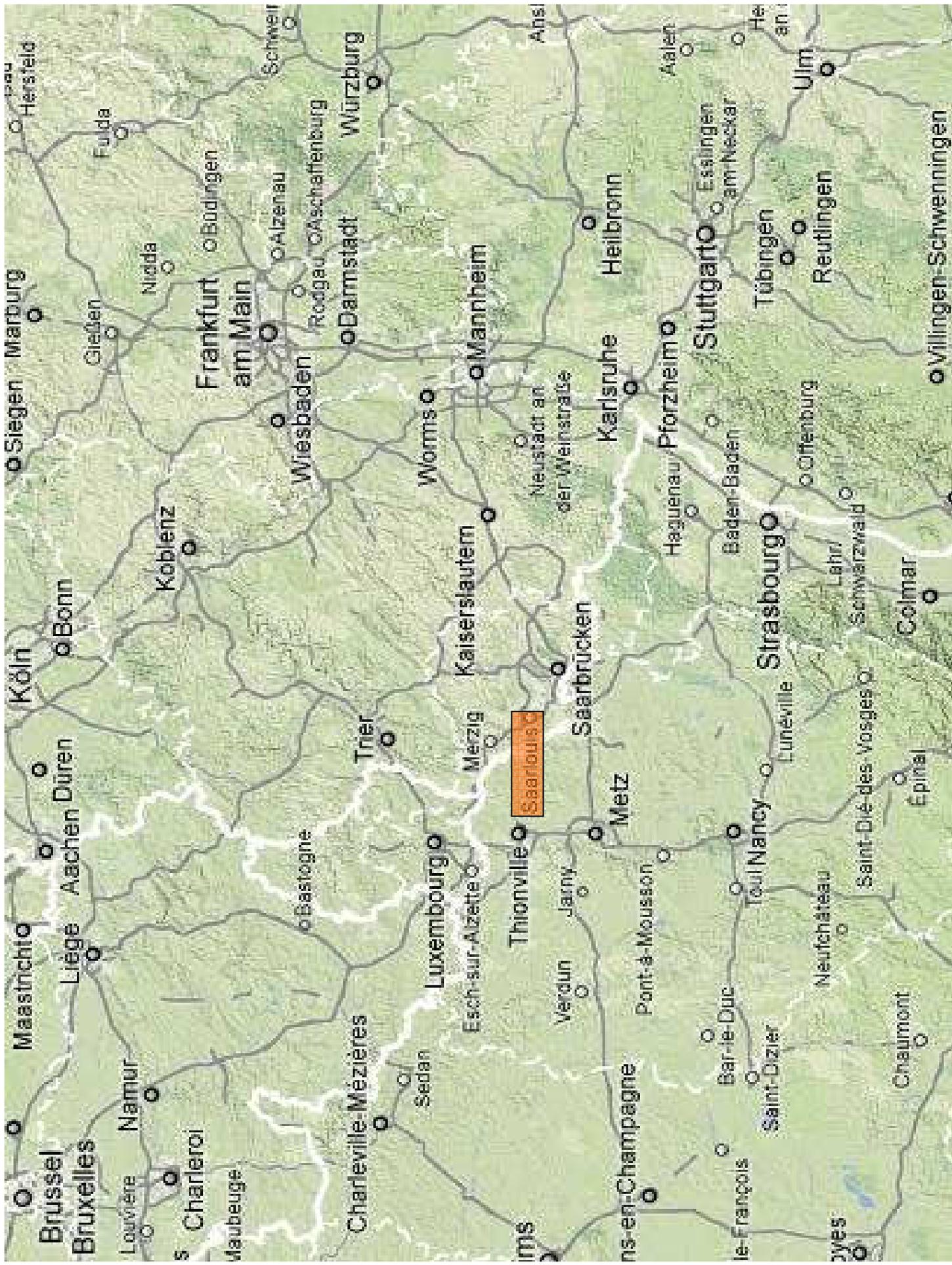

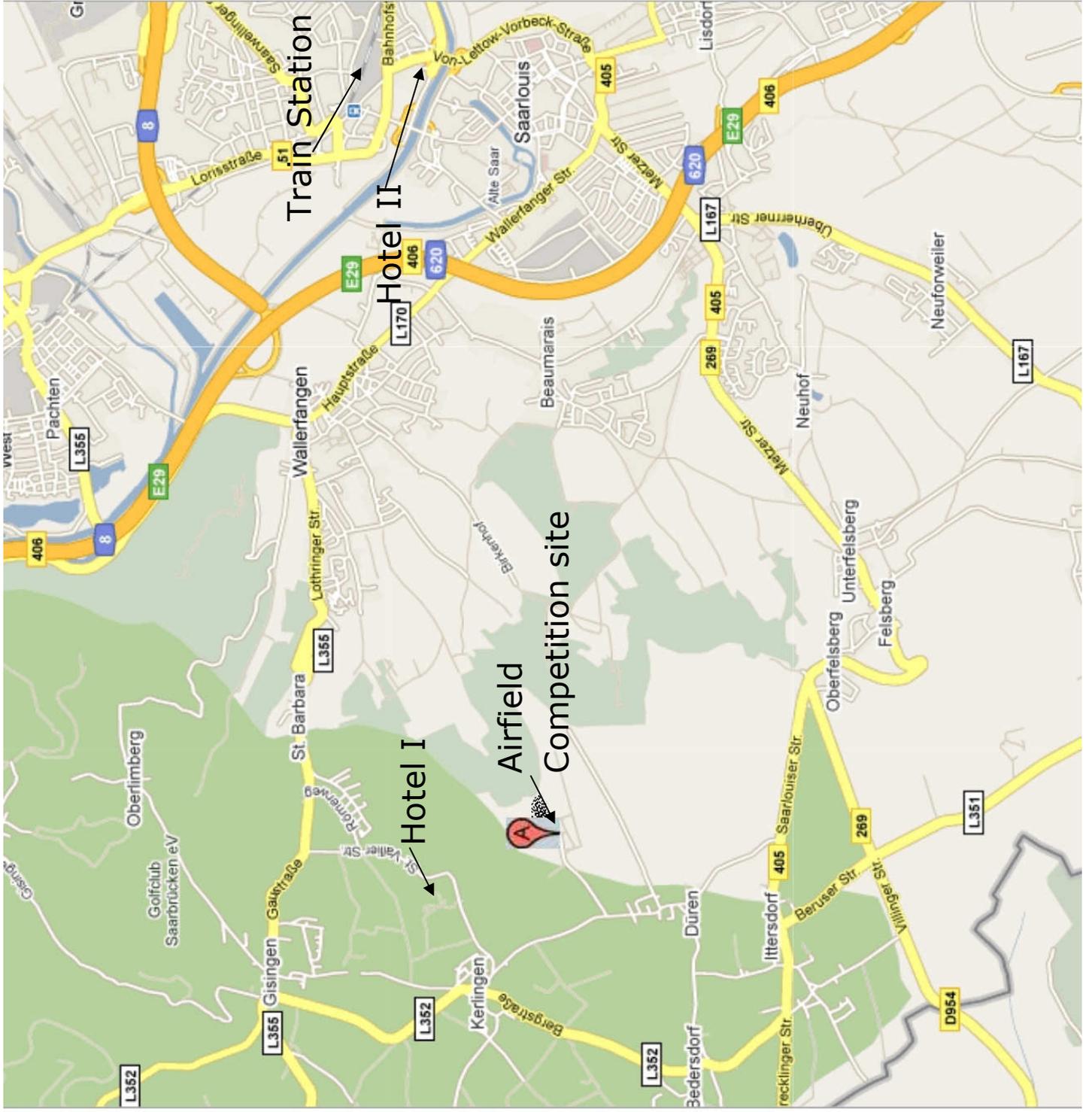

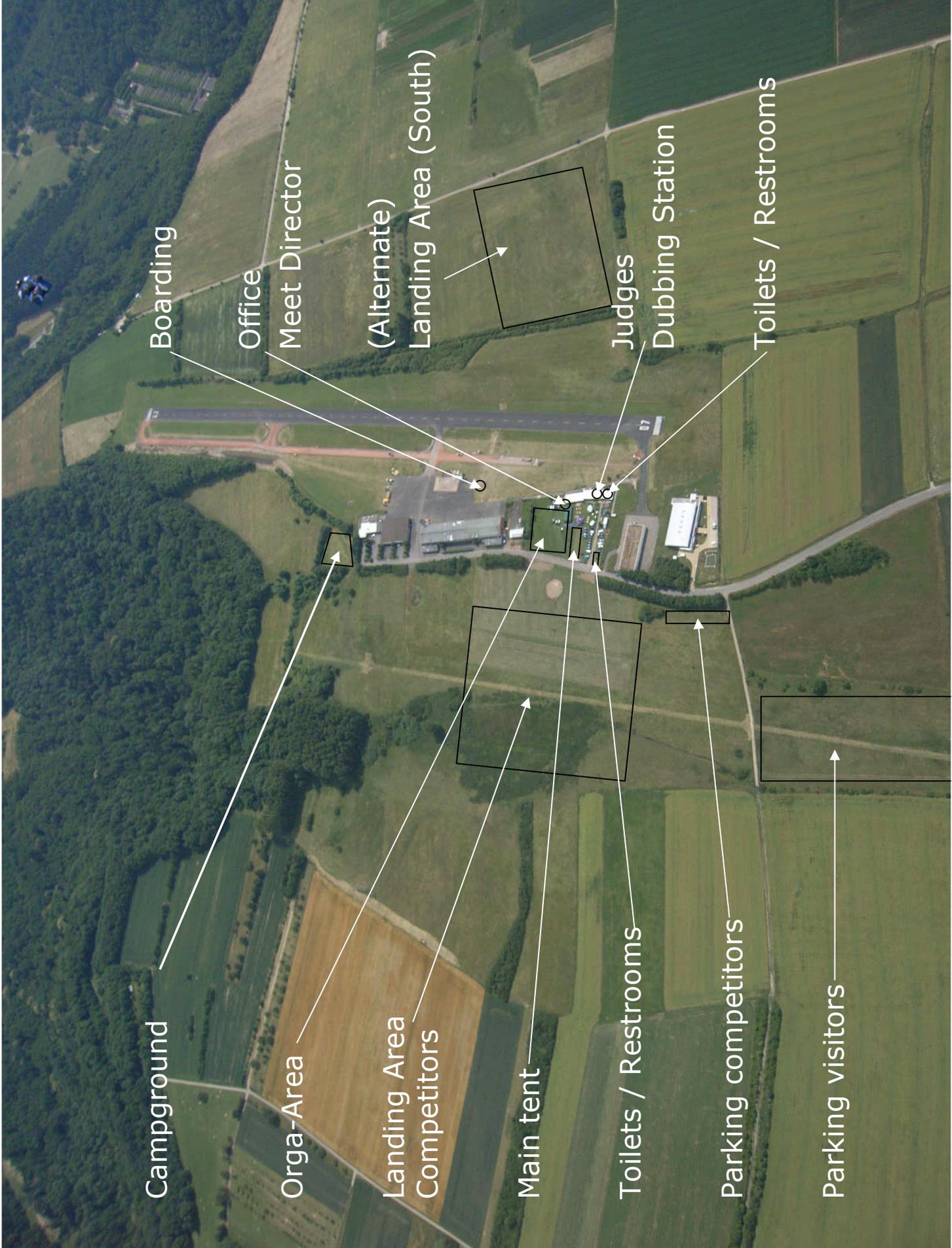
