1 The World Games – In Short – FAQ

What is it?

The World Games are organised by the International World Games Association under the patronage of the International Olympic Committee. They are the largest multi-sport Games next to the Olympic Games and take place every 4 years.

Where is it?

In Wroclaw, Poland. Parachuting, Glider Aerobatics and Paramotoring will take place on the Szymanow Airfield Field, about 10 km to the North of the City of Wroclaw.

When is it?

20th July to 30th July 2017. Air Sports competitions are from 20th-24th of July with competitors arriving earlier for acclimatisation and training. The official departure day is 25th July.

Who will be there?

In total, 43 sports. Air Sports include Parachuting (Canopy Piloting), Paramotoring and Glider Aerobatics and grouped as »Trend Sports«.

Accreditation

Pre-registered competitors and officials (see 9.1) shall receive a personal Identity Card with a given priority status. WOC will set up an accreditation office in the assigned official hotel (see 16.3 and 16.4).

What costs are involved for participants?

You must pay for your own travel to and from Wroclaw, including your sports equipment plus ensure you have adequate insurance cover. There is no entry fee to attend TWG 2017.

What costs are covered?

Local costs including competition infrastructure, accommodation, meals and local transport are paid by the Wroclaw Local Organising Committee (WOC). Transport includes travelling from the airport to the Accreditation Office in the hotel assigned to all the three air sport disciplines. WOC will provide free local shuttles at appropriate times between accommodation areas, meal centres and ceremonial areas.

Can I stay on afterwards for a holiday?

Your local costs will be paid until the official departure day, but you can stay in Poland at your own cost, if you wish.

Can my friend/spouse/trainer/team manager accompany me?

Your official invite is personal to you. This follows the idea of the “Olympic Village”; the host is obliged to take care of athletes and officials. Any other accompanying people are welcome to come with you but are not included in the official programme and must pay all costs themselves. The accompanying persons will have to buy tickets to enter the venues. Technically it is not possible to book them into the reserved official hotel for athletes/officials.

2 The World Games & International World Games Association

The World Games (TWG 2017) is the biggest multi-sport events globally in 2017. For the FAI and the air sport disciplines this event offers the closest experience for our athletes with the “Olympic Environment”. The close cooperation between the International World Games Association (IWGA) and the International Olympic Committee (IOC) is best reflected in these recent announcements.

IOC approves closer cooperation with IWGA

The IOC and the International World Games Association should “... closely cooperate regarding the sports program composition and their respective evaluations.” The decision was taken unanimously during an Extraordinary Session of the IOC on Monday. The recommendation is part of the Olympic Agenda 2020, a ‘strategic roadmap’ for the future of the Olympic Movement.

Memorandum of Understanding between IOC and IWGA signed

IOC Recognizes Importance of The World Games. The new agreement confirms that “the IOC recognises the importance of The World Games as a multi-sport event and the IWGA is committed to develop its activities in the Olympic spirit and in conformity with the Olympic Charter.”

As a consequence, many of our members receive national recognition and support by their respective National Olympic Committees.

5.2 Extra Officials

Arrangements for extra officials (i.e. those beyond the approved number of 32) are a matter of individual agreement between the ASC and with the FAI Lausanne (sports@fai.org).

5.3 Volunteers

The WOC set up a scheme for volunteers. The number of volunteers supporting the running of the competitions have been identified in cooperation with the ASCs.

6 FAI disciplines and resources

6.1 FAI Workshop June 2016

Three main topics had been discussed and agreed during a workshop with attendees from the air sport commissions and the FAI Head Office:

- Resources, officials and volunteers needed to run the competitions.
- Tentative schedule of activities (time-table for the three air sport disciplines)
- Jury composition

A significant number of volunteers is additionally needed for activities that ease in running the event.

6.2 Athletes

The total number of athletes (pilots, parachutists) is 66.

- Paramotoring 18 athletes, see Annex 02.
- Glider Aerobatics 12 athletes, see Annex 03.
- Parachuting – Canopy Piloting 36 athletes, see Annex 04.

6.3 Selection Process Athletes

The selection and confirmation process followed an agreed sequence:

FAI Air Sport Commissions decided about the selection criteria for the available slots. The criteria are shown in the annexes 02, 03 and 04.

After identifying the athletes, the appointed liaisons in each ASC contacted the NACs to obtain their confirmation.

Individual participants had then been informed about their confirmed selection.

Unconfirmed slots had been returned into the selection process of the Air Sport Commissions for the next candidate on the list.

6.4 Appointment process of Officials

Officials had been selected by the relevant FAI ASC. The overall number of IWGA approved officials (IF Passport) is 32 and splits as follows:

- Paramotoring 7 officials, see annex 02.
- Glider Aerobatics 9 officials, see Annex 03.
- Parachuting – Canopy Piloting 11, see Annex 04.
- Overhead Safety 5, Jury President, Overall IT, Overall Competition Manager,

When we are closer to the event and all details are sorted, some re-arrangements may occur in agreement with the ASCs.

6.5 Jury

The way the jury is appointed and will work, deviates from the standard procedures as described in the FAI General Section Sporting Code as well as in the ASC specific sporting codes.

A “super jury” is intended to be put in place. The concept of the Jury composition and its work is to have

- one CASI appointed Jury President and have
- one appointed jury member from each ASC (CIMA, CIVA, IPC)

This is work in progress between FAI Lausanne and CASI. Details will be announced latest in the General Briefing.

6.6 Overall

6.7 Schedule of ActivitiesPlanning Principle

ASC representatives agreed to present all three disciplines on each day. If possible, a visitor friendly start of the competitions at 08.00 local time is planned.

Please note that sunrise is around 05.00 local time (CEST); sunset at around 21.00 local time (CEST).

The time slots for each discipline should be long enough to allow for full rounds in each discipline and allow spectators to attend all three disciplines at any given day within a 3-4 hour time window at the airfield.

Daily briefings will be conducted to allow for necessary adjustments, mainly due to meteorological implications.

7.2 Commitments for the athletes

WOC will provide all so-called “in country cost”, namely:

- Transport: Airport – Hotel, Hotel – Venue, Hotel – Opening Ceremony
- Accreditation (access passes, tickets); see 9.4, 16.3 and 16.4
- Accommodation in Single and Twin rooms. The assignment to the rooms will be done in cooperation with the ASC liaison.
- Meals
- Technical equipment for competition and training facilities including fuel.

- Medical services
- Security services
- Ceremonies and Medals

7.3 Commitments for the officials

Officials will receive the same benefits as the athletes, see 7.2.

7.4 Travel subsidy for officials

Approved FAI officials will receive travel subsidies from an FAI support budget as is the agreement for other FAI category 1-championships and according to ASC specific regulations.

7.5 Opening Ceremony

The Opening Ceremony takes place on 20 July 2017 at 19.00 CEST in the Wroclaw Stadium and it will last for 2 hours.

All athletes (66) and Officials (32) will get free admission with their “Accreditation ID”. Transport arrangements to/from the accommodation to the stadium are communicated after arrival.

8 Bulletins, Equipment

Three different kinds of bulletins are being published:

8.1 WOC – bulletins

These bulletins are published by WOC and hold information of general interest and must-know-items to attend the TWG 2017. Please visit the respective websites to find information about TWG 2017 and the City of Wroclaw.

8.2 FAI General Bulletin

This bulletin provides FAI stakeholders (mainly participating athletes and officials) with general information.

8.3 Sport-specific bulletins

Three dedicated bulletins aiming at competitors and officials will be issued for

- paramotoring,
- glider aerobatics and
- parachuting canopy piloting.

These bulletins will provide the core information related to the competitions, the task catalogue as well as relevant local regulations for the respective air sport disciplines.

The bulletins will be emailed to the participants/ officials but also made available for download.

8.4 Equipment

9 Registration, Accreditation & Information

9.1 Registration via TWG 2017 Event Management System

All athletes and officials must self-register and FAI will provide tools to assist in that process. FAI will then upload the data into the “TWG 2017 Event Management System by Swiss Timing” which is the backbone for WOC and Swiss Timing to handle all participants and the overall dataflow of TWG 2017.

FAI will approach athletes and officials to submit their relevant data in two different data-collection exercises (called “surveys”).

Each athlete and official will receive an email with detailed instructions. Two different data-surveys will assist in entering the relevant data.

- **Survey 1: Data required by IWGA/WOC (focus on the accreditation)**
- **Survey 2: Data required by the FAI (focus on communication and media work. Collecting participant’s experience)**

It is of utmost importance that athletes and officials respond in a timely and reliable way.

9.2 Privacy Protection

The Wroclaw Organising Committee (WOC) abides by all European and Polish law requirements and follows legal data protection needs. Details about the use of the data will be given to all who registered during the accreditation process after your arrival to Wroclaw.

9.3 Visas

Since December 21, 2007, Poland is part of the Schengen Area, a zone without controls on internal borders which comprises of 28 countries. Third-country nationals may enter Poland if they are in possession of a valid travel document and a visa (if required). Council Regulation includes the lists of third countries whose nationals must possess valid visas to cross external borders, and of countries whose nationals are exempt from this obligation.

Athletes / Officials that indicated in their registration process that they have to apply for a visa will receive the invitation or a download-link during May 2017.

With the TWG 2017 invitation and the personal valid passport, participants (VIPs, Athletes, Officials and Extra-Officials) are eligible for Visa-exempt entry.

9.4 Accreditation after arrival by WOC

Athletes and Officials will be accredited after their arrival in their dedicated hotel; see 16.3 and 16.4. Access Passes and further details are going to be handed out there.

9.5 Check-In by FAI

Athletes are requested to present the following when checking in

- Where applicable: pilot licence, radio licence, logbook, medical, passport or other ID
- Where applicable (for the aircraft): certificate of registration, certificate of airworthiness, airworthiness review certificate, proof of insurance.
- FAI sporting licenses must have been uploaded to the FAI-database latest until 07 July 2017.

9.6 FAI Sporting License

The World Games 2017 are classified as “FAI First Category Event” for each of the three disciplines. Competitors must hold a valid FAI Sporting License to be allowed to participate. More information about the FAI Sporting License is available on the FAI-webpages.

9.7 Agreement

Athletes are requested to sign a legal disclaimer addressing rules, risks, responsibility, rights to images and data during the check-in procedure.

9.8 FAI Event Management Tool

FAI with its FAI Global Technical Partner “Noosphere” established an “FAI Event Management Tool”.

This tool will assist in the preparation and the management of the three air sport disciplines. A key focus is on the results management and presentation of the athletes.

Data collected in the surveys (see 9.1) will also feed a dedicated FAI-Event-Website and we shall communicate more detailed information in due course.

10 Safety, Anti-Doping

10.1 Mandatory briefings for Athletes and Officials

Safety is paramount. Attendance at the Safety Briefing is mandatory for athletes and officials.

Safety Briefing: For each discipline a safety briefing will have to be conducted.

General Briefing: The General Briefing is open to all disciplines and will address overall organizational issues.

Event Directors will communicate at least one opportunity for athletes to attend a safety briefing.

The FAI will set up a location, date and time for the General Briefing.

Athletes and Officials will sign their attendance.

Strictly no training, flying or sky-diving permitted without having attended the safety briefing.

10.2 Insurance

WOC informed as follows: The World Games participant must be insured against minimum costs of treatment. Without proof of health insurance (in English) TWG 2017 participant must not be accredited. There will be possibility to buy insurance in accreditation centers (cost ca. 40euro/week). The minimum desired insurance coverage is 200'000 zł (ca. 50'000euro).

10.3 Anti-Doping

11 Communication

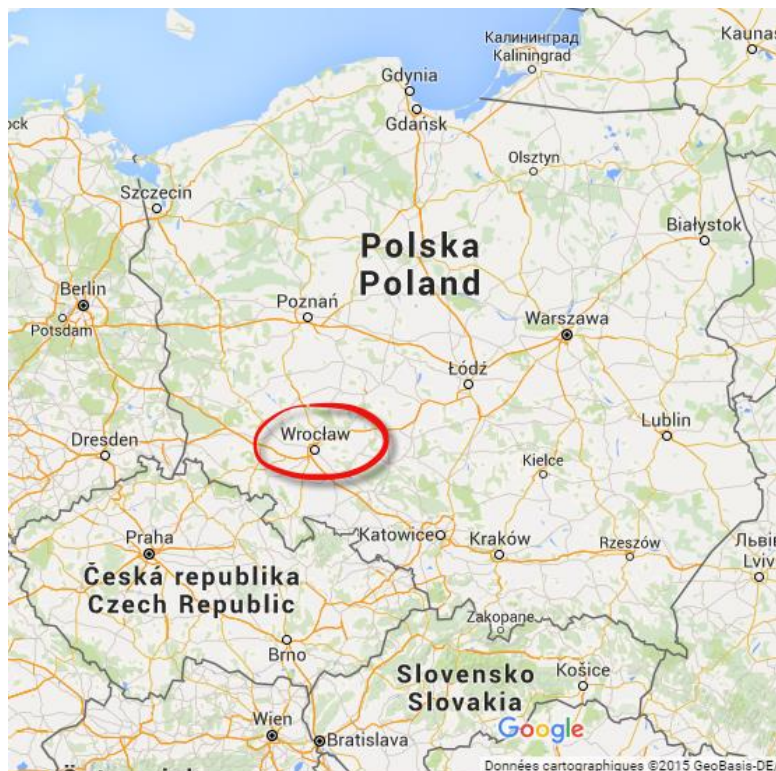
