Agenda

1. Welcome (PE)
PE welcomed the members of the Bureau.
2. 2024 IGC Plenary, Toulouse 1-2 March 2024
The Bureau reviewed the Agenda for the meeting and suggested a few changes:
 - Agenda item 5.3 (Overview IGC Sanction Fees 2024 – 2025) to be added.
 - Agenda item 6.2.2 (Handicap calculation formula) to be to be processed together with agenda item 10.2.2.b.
 - Agenda item 6.3.3 (Accreditation of Championship Directors) to be to be processed together with agenda item 10.3.1.
 - The proposals from the States to be discussed first.
 - The late IGC handicap list proposal (Year-1) will be dealt with under Reports.
 - Proposal for officials for the 2025 Championships to be developed by the CMC for endorsement by the Bureau.
 - IGC Champion Pilot of the Year to be added.
 - Late proposal from Poland to be added under item 15 (AOB).

Action: VF to update the agenda for publication before the Plenary meeting.

Action: VF to add all IGC committee and WG chairs as well as IGC specialists / representatives to the igc-delegates email list and inform the persons concerned.

Decision: The Bureau decided to develop a proposal for a rule that would make the energy control at the start optional at all Championships.

Action: RS to draft a proposal for a rule to make energy control optional at the start.
3. AOB
 - The Bureau discussed the future needs of IGC in relation to scope of activities of the ANDS and GFAC.
Decision: The Bureau decided to form WG with the representatives of the affected parties to review the ANDS and GFAC scope of activities and propose a new structure that



will focus on IGC's future scientific, and research needs while maintaining the current GFAC activities.

- The Bureau received the request concerning possibility to participate for the world champion in 18m class at Women WGC 2022 in WGC 2024 Uvalde.

Decision: The Bureau decided to allow champions from Women WGC 2022 in the UK to participate in WGC 2023 in Uvalde.
