

Eloy, Arizona is in the US State of Arizona, in the sunny southwestern part of the country. The field elevation is 370 meters above sea level. The Latitude is N32\* 48' 17" and the Longitude is W111\*34.47. Entering the search term "Skydive Arizona" into Google Earth or Google Maps will produce images and map information.



## 4. Access to Location & Transportation

All competitors are responsible for their own transportation. The nearest international airport is Phoenix Sky Harbor Airport (PHX), located just under 100 km from the competition site by modern, toll-free highways: <a href="https://www.skyharbor.com/">https://www.skyharbor.com/</a>.

The drive time from Sky Harbor to Skydive Arizona is approximately one hour.

Foreigners do not need an International Driver's License as long as they have a valid driver's license from their home country. Rental car companies may have additional requirements. There are no public transportation systems from Phoenix to Eloy, so a rental car is the best option. Rental cars from all major rental companies are available at the airport.

### 6. Drop Zone

Skydive Arizona is a full service drop zone with an on-site wind tunnel that has been in operation at its Eloy location since April of 1991. Since then, Skydive Arizona has hosted twelve US National Skydiving Championships and six ISC First Category Events. ## 7. Aircraft Details

Skydive Arizona has 6 identically configured De Havilland Twin otters which will be used for the competition. The airplanes carry up to 23 jumpers. All have identical floater bars inside the door and a videographer step and handles outside, behind the door.





Door measurements are 127cm. high and 140cm. wide. A floater bar the length of the door is inside the plane. 84 cm. behind the door on the same level as the floor, is a videographer's step. Above and behind the door are videographer handles.

Exit speed will be 85 - 90 knots.

#### 8. Pre-event

Skydive Arizona operates seven days a week from October 1 - May 17, 7:45 AM until sunset. The dropzone is closed on Tuesday and Wednesday, May 18 through September 30. Current lift ticket value is \$33 per jump.

#### 9. Accommodation Details

All delegations are responsible for their own food, lodging and transportation. Rental cars are available at the arrival airport in Phoenix: https://www.skyharbor.com/.

A restaurant and bar, The Bent Prop, is located on the drop zone. There are various other options located within eight to twenty-five km. Casa Grande, a city of about 55,000 people, is 20 km. away.

## 10. Equipment

Please note that the US Federal Aviation Administration does not have a reciprocity agreement to allow foreign skydivers to use their equipment as accepted by their own NAC. Unless the equipment has *no* components with a Technical Standard Order, the parachutes must be packed according to US Federal Aviation Regulations. This means packed by an FAA certified rigger, within 180 days, and with a seal on the reserve.

#### 12. Judging & Scoring

Omniskore! will be used to score all events.

Results will be published according to Sporting Code Section 5.

## 13. Medical / emergency details

Skydive Arizona has a longstanding professional relationship with regional Emergency Medical Services. Ambulance response time is usually within less than 10 minutes. Skydive Arizona is also home to an Air Evac Helicopter service. Manifest and Ground Safety Officers have direct radio contact. The nearest hospital is in Casa Grande which is 15km away.

#### 14. Insurance details

It is highly recommended that all participants check with their health insurance provider about the validity of their

insurance in the US. If there is any doubt, consider travel insurance. Note that some travel insurance policies specifically exclude any coverage of skydiving related injuries. A minimum of \$250,000 medical and repatriation coverage is recommended

All participants must have third party liability insurance. If membership in your NAC normally provides this, check to see if it is valid in the United States and has a minimum coverage of \$50,000. If not, you will be required to join the United States Parachute Association for the required liability insurance.

#### 15. Visa information

#### 16. Rules and Regulations

Skydive Arizona adheres to the USPA Basic Safety Regulations. Minimum opening altitude is 2,500 feet/750 meters. Helmets and AADs are not required, but are highly recommended. #### 17. Weather

The weather in October tends to be warm and dry during the day, cool and clear at night. Temperatures typically range from daytime highs of 35C and nighttime lows around 15C. Average sunrise is 06:26, sunset 18:02.

#### 18. Other Matters

#### **National Flag and Anthem**

Each delegation must bring its own National Flag (approximately 100 cm x 150 cm) and its National Anthem in a downloadable format (CD, MP4) to be used in ceremonies.

#### **Electrical Power Standard**

The USA uses a different power system than most countries. Our electrical standard is 120 volts, 60 Hz, and plug type A/B. It is the responsibility of attendees to acquire a plug converter for any devices you wish to charge. These are widely available in travel stores but are not available locally.
