- 1) Make sure we have enough competent people to act as e CJ and EJ.
- 2) Make sure live judging is quick and accurate. To achieve this, Judges need more training before each competition, and/or we need to make DY easier to judge.

The technical side of the competition worked very well, the organizer had done a great job with setting up the judging systems. Uploading videos by the teams into the FAI cloud failed for an unknown reason and we had to use WeTransfer for that, adding some unexpected organization time for this process.

The judging worked okay, but some judges used their right to review the flights too frequently. This is detrimental to the audience and flyers if the result of the review is different from that of the live judging (lights go off in the tunnel when the flyers bust). We are discussing solutions to this challenge.

The committee continues to improve the competition rules by simplifying them when possible and by improving them according to the feedback from the judges and the competitors especially after Charleroi and the national competitions.

Communication

We have held monthly electronic meetings during the year, only pausing for the 3 summer months. For most meetings we have an agenda and record the minutes. This has helped us track the rule changes, and has significantly reduced the workload in the weeks leading up to, and during, the Plenary meetings.

Judges
